HE Lord is my light, and my salvation ; whom then shall I fear : the
Lord is the strength of my life ; of whom then shall I be afraid ?

2 When the wicked, even mine enemies and my foes, came upon me
to eat up my flesh : they stum-bled and fell.

3 Though an host of men were laid against me, yet shall not my heart be afraid :
and though there rose up war against me, yet will I put my trust in him.

4 One thing have I desired of the Lord, which I will require : even that I may
dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to behold the fair beauty of
the Lord, and to vis-it his temple.

5 For in the time of trouble he shall hide me in his taber-nacle : yea, in the secret
place of his dwelling shall he hide me, and set me up up-on a rock of stone.

6 And now shall he lift up mine head : above mine ene-mies round about me.

7 Therefore will I offer in his dwelling an oblation with great gladness : I will

8 The Lord is my strength, and my shield ; my heart hath trusted in him, and I
am helped : therefore my heart danceth for joy, and in my song will I praise him.

9 The Lord is my strength : and he is the wholesome defence of his Anointed.

and set them up for ever.

10 Shall the dust give thanks un-to thee : or shall it declare thy truth ?

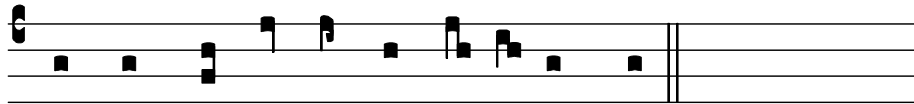
11 Hear, O Lord, and have mer-cy up-on me : Lord, be thou my helper.

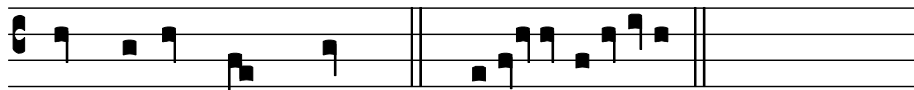

5 Draw me out of the net, that they have laid pri-vily for me : — for thou art my

6 Into thy hands I com-mend my spirit : for thou hast redeemed me, O Lord,
thou God of truth.

7 I have hated them that hold of super-stitious va-nities : and my trust hath been
in the Lord.

8 I will be glad, and re-joyce in thy mercy : for thou hast considered my trouble,
and hast known my soul in adversities.

9 Thou hast not shut me up into the hand of the en-emy : but hast set my feet
in a large room.

10 Have mercy upon me, O Lord, for I am in trouble : and mine eye is consumed
for very heaviness ; yea, my soul and my body.

11 For my life is waxen old with hea-viness : and my years with mourning.

12 My strength faileth me, because of mine i-ni-quity : and my bones are
consumed.

13 I became a reproach among all mine enemies, but especially a-mong my
neighbours : and they of mine acquaintance were afraid of me ; and they that did
see me without con-vey-ed themselves from me.

14 I am clean forgotten, as a dead man out of mind : I am become like a bro-ken
vessel.

15 For I have heard the blasphemy of the mul-titude : and fear is on every side,
while they conspire together against me, and take their counsel to take away my life.

16 But my hope hath been in thee, O Lord : I have said, Thou art my God.

17 My time is in thy hand ; deliver me from the hand of mine en-emies : and
from them that per-secute me.

18 Shew thy servant the light of thy countenance : and save me for thy mercy's sake.

19 Let me not be confounded, O Lord, for I have called up-on thee : let the ungodly be put to confusion, and be put to silence in the grave.

20 Let the lying lips be put to silence : which cruelly, disdainfully, and despitefully, speak against the righteous.

21 O how plentiful is thy goodness, which thou hast laid up for them that fear thee : and that thou hast prepared for them that put their trust in thee, even before the sons of men !

22 Thou shalt hide them privily by thine own presence from the provoking of all men : thou shalt keep them secretly in thy tabernacle from the strife of tongues.

23 Thanks be to the Lord : for he hath shewed me marvellous great kindness in a strong city.

24 And when I made haste, I said : I am cast out of the sight of thine eyes.

25 Nevertheless, thou heardest the voice of my prayer : when I cried unto thee.

26 O love the Lord, all ye his saints : for the Lord preserveth them that are faithful, and plentifully rewardeth the proud doer.

27 Be strong, and he shall establish your heart : all ye that put your trust in the Lord.

Psalm 32. Beati quorum. xxxj.

Blessed is he whose unrighteousness is forgiven : and whose sin is covered.

2 Blessed is the man unto whom the Lord imputeth no sin : and in whose spirit there is no guile.

3 For while I held my tongue : my bones consumed away through my daily

4 For thy hand is heavy up-on me ³⁴⁷ day ²⁵⁸ and ¹⁶ night : and my moisture is like the ⁴
¹⁵⁶⁷⁸ drought in summer. ²³

5 I will acknowledge my sin un-to thee : and mine unrighteous-ness have I not
hid.

6 I said, I will confess my sins un-to the Lord : and so thou forgavest the wick-
¹⁶⁸ ed-ness of my sin. ²³

7 For this shall every one that is godly make his prayer unto thee, in a time when
³⁴⁷ thou mayest be found : but in the great water-floods they shall not come nigh him. ⁴ ¹⁵⁶⁷⁸ ²³

8 Thou art a place to hide me in, thou shalt pre-serve me from trouble : thou
⁴⁵⁷ shalt compass me about with songs of deliverance. ¹⁶⁸ ²³

9 I will inform thee, and teach thee in the way wherein thou shalt go : and I will
¹⁵⁶⁷⁸ guide thee with mine eye. ²³

10 Be ye not like to horse and mule, which have no under-standing : whose
³⁷ mouths must be held with bit and bridle, lest they fall upon thee. ⁴ ¹²⁵⁶⁸

11 Great plagues remain for the un-godly : but whoso putteth his trust in the
⁴ Lord, mercy embrac-eth him on every side. ¹⁵⁶⁷⁸ ²³

12 Be glad, O ye righteous, and re-joyce in the Lord : and be joyful, all ye that are
true of heart.

2 Praise the Lord with harp : sing praises unto him with the lute, and instrument of ten strings.

3 Sing unto the Lord a new song : sing praises lustily unto him with a good courage.

4 For the word of the Lord is true : and all his works are faithful.

5 He loveth righteousness and judgement : the earth is full of the goodness of the Lord.

6 By the word of the Lord were the heavens made : and all the hosts of them by breath of his mouth.

7 He gathereth the waters of the sea together, as it were upon an heap : and layeth up the deep, as in a treasure-house.

8 Let all the earth fear the Lord : stand in awe of him, all ye that dwell in the world.

9 For he spake, and it was done : he commanded, and it stood fast.

10 The Lord bringeth the counsel of the heathen to nought : and maketh the devices of the people to be of none effect, and casteth out the counsels of princes.

11 The counsel of the Lord shall endure for ever : and the thoughts of his heart from generation to generation.

12 Blessed are the people whose God is the Lord Jehovah : and blessed are the folk, that he hath chosen to him to be his inheritance.

13 The Lord looked down from heaven, and beheld all the children of men : from the

habitation of his dwelling, he considereth all them that dwell on the earth.

14 He fashioneth all the hearts of them : and un-der-stand-eth all their works.

15 There is no king that can be saved by the mul-titude of an host : neither is any mighty man deli-ver-ed by much strength.

16 A horse is counted but a vain thing to save a man : neither shall he deliver any man by his great strength.

17 Behold, the eye of the Lord is upon them that fear him : and upon them that put their trust in his mercy ;

18 To de-liv-er their soul from death : and to feed them in the time of dearth.

19 Our soul hath patiently tar-ried for the Lord : for he is our help and our shield.

20 For our heart shall re-joice in him : because we have ho-ped in his holy Name.

21 Let thy merciful kindness, O Lord, be up-on us : like as we do put our trust in thee.

Psalm 34. Benedicam Dominum. xxxiiij.

I will always give thanks un-to the Lord : his praise shall ev-er be in my mouth.

2 My soul shall make her boast in the Lord : the humble shall hear there-of, and be glad.

3 O praise the Lord with me : and let us magnify his Name together.

4 I sought the Lord, and he heard me : yea, he delivered me out of all my fear.

5 They had an eye unto him, and were light-ened : and their faces were not ashamed.

6 Lo, the poor crieth, and the Lord hear-eth him : yea, and saveth him out of all his troubles.

7 The angel of the Lord tarrieth round about them that fear him : and de-liv-ereth them.

8 O taste, and see, how gra-cious the Lord is : blessed is the man that trust-eth
in him.

9 O fear the Lord, ye that are his saints : for they that fear him lack nothing.

10 The lions do lack, and suffer hunger : but they who seek the Lord shall want
no man-ner of thing that is good.

11 Come, ye children, and hearken un-to me : I will teach you the fear of the
Lord.

12 What man is he that lusteth to live : and would fain see good days ?

13 Keep thy tongue from evil : and thy lips, that they speak no guile.

14 Eschew evil, and do good : seek peace, and ensue it.

15 The eyes of the Lord are o-ver the righteous : and his ears are o-pen unto
their prayers.

16 The countenance of the Lord is against them that do evil : to root out the
remem-brance of them from the earth.

17 The righteous cry, and the Lord hear-eth them : and delivereth them out of
all their troubles.

18 The Lord is nigh unto them that are of a con-trite heart : and will save such as
be of an hum-ble spirit.

19 Great are the troubles of the righteous : but the Lord deliv-er-eth him out of
all.


20 He keepeth all his bones : so that not one of them is broken.


21 But misfortune shall slay the un-godly : and they that hate the right-eous shall
be desolate.

22 The Lord delivereth the souls of his servants : and all they that put their trust

in him shall not be destitute.

4 Let them be confounded, and put to shame, that seek after my soul : let them be turned back, and brought to confusion, that ima-gine mis-chief for me.

5 Let them be as the dust be-fore the wind : and the angel of the Lord scat-tering them.

6 Let their way be dark and slip-pery : and let the angel of the Lord per-secute them.

7 For they have privily laid their net to des-troy me with-out a cause : yea, even without a cause have they made a pit for my soul.

8 Let a sudden destruction come upon him unawares, and his net that he hath laid pri-vily, catch himself : that he may fall in-to his own mischief.

9 And my soul shall be joyful in the Lord : it shall rejoice in his salvation.

10 All my bones shall say, Lord, who is like unto thee, who deliverest the poor from him that is too strong for him : yea, the poor, and him that is in misery, from him that spoileth him ?

11 False witnes-ses did rise up : they laid to my charge things that I knew not.

12 They rewarded me evil for good : to the great dis-com-fort of my soul.

13 Nevertheless, when they were sick, I put on sackcloth, and humbled my soul with fasting : and my prayer shall turn in-to mine own bosom.

14 I behaved myself as though it had been my friend, or my brother : I went heavily, as one that mourn-eth for his mother.

15 But in mine adversity they rejoiced, and gathered them-selves to-gether : yea, the very objects came together against me unawares, making mouths at me, and ceased not.

16 With the flatterers were busy mockers : who gnashed up-on me with their teeth.

17 Lord, how long wilt thou look up-on this : O deliver my soul from the calamities which they bring on me, and my dar-ling from the lions.

18 So will I give thee thanks in the great congre-gation : I will praise thee a-mong much people.

19 O let not them that are mine enemies triumph over me un-godly : neither let them wink with their eyes that hate me without a cause.

20 And why ? their com-mun-ing is not for peace : but they imagine deceitful

words against them that are ^{4 15678 23} qui-et in the land.

21 They gaped upon me ³⁴⁷ with their mouths, and said : Fie on thee, fie on thee,
^{4 15678 23} we saw it with our eyes.

22 This thou hast seen, O Lord : hold not thy tongue then, go not far from me,
O Lord.

23 Awake, and stand up to judge my quarrel : avenge thou my cause, my God,
and my Lord.

24 Judge me, O Lord my God, according to thy ³⁴⁷ right-eousness : and let them not
^{15678 23} tri-umph over me.

25 Let them not say in their hearts, There, there, so would we have it : neither
let them say, ^{457 168 23} We have devoured him.

26 Let them be put to confusion and shame together that re-joyce at my trouble :
let them be clothed with rebuke and dishonour, that boast them-selves against me.

27 Let them be glad and rejoyce, that favour my ³⁴⁷ righteous ¹²⁵⁶⁸ dealing : yea, let them
say always, Blessed be the Lord, who hath pleasure in the prosperi-ty of his servant.

28 And as for my tongue, it shall be talking of thy ³⁴⁷ right-eousness : and of thy

MY heart sheweth me the wickedness of the ^{37 4 12568} un-godly : that there is no fear

3 The words of his mouth are unrighteous and ^{4 37 258 16} full of deceit : he hath left off to
behave himself wise-ly, and to do good.

4 He imagineth mischief upon his bed, and hath set him-self in no good way :
neither doth he abhor any thing that is evil.

5 Thy mercy, O Lord, reacheth un-to the heavens : and thy faith-ful-ness unto
the clouds.

6 Thy righteousness standeth like the strong mountains : thy judgements are like
the great deep.

7 Thou, Lord, shalt save both man and beast ; how excellent is thy mercy, O
God : and the children of men shall put their trust under the sha-dow of thy wings.

8 They shall be satisfied with the plen-teousness of thy house : and thou shalt
give them drink of thy pleasures, as out of the river.

9 For with thee is the well of life : and in thy light shall we see light.

10 O continue forth thy loving-kindness unto them that know thee : and thy
righteousness unto them that are true of heart.

11 O let not the foot of pride come a-against me : and let not the hand of the un-
god-ly cast me down.

12 There are they fallen, all that work wick-edness : they are cast down, and shall
not be a-ble to stand.

Fret not thyself because of the un-godly : neither be thou envious against the e-vil doers.

2 For they shall soon be cut down like the grass : and be withered ev-en as the green herb.

3 Put thou thy trust in the Lord, and be do-ing good : dwell in the land, and ve-ri-ly thou shalt be fed.

4 De-light thou in the Lord : and he shall give thee thy heart's desire.

5 Commit thy way unto the Lord, and put thy trust in him : and he shall bring it to pass.

6 He shall make thy righteousness as clear as the light : and thy just deal-ing as the noon-day.

7 Hold thee still in the Lord, and abide patient-ly up-on him : but grieve not thyself at him, whose way doth prosper, against the man that doeth af-ter e-vil counsels.

8 Leave off from wrath, and let go dis-pleasure : fret not thyself, else shalt thou be mov-ed to do evil.

9 Wicked doers shall be root-ed out : and they that patiently abide the Lord, those shall in-he-rit the land.

10 Yet a little while, and the ungodly shall be clean gone : thou shalt look after

his place, and he shall be away.

11 But the meek-spirited shall possess the earth : and shall be refreshed in the multitude of peace.

12 The ungodly seeketh counsel against the just : and gnasheth upon him with his teeth.

13 The Lord shall laugh him to scorn : for he hath seen that his day is coming.

14 The ungodly have drawn out the sword, and have bent their bow : to cast down the poor and needy, and to slay such as are of a right conversation.

15 Their sword shall go through their own heart : and their bow shall be broken.

16 A small thing that the righteous hath : is better than great riches of the ungodly.

17 For the arms of the ungodly shall be broken : and the Lord upholdeth the righteous.

18 The Lord knoweth the days of the godly : and their inheritance shall endure for ever.

19 They shall not be confounded in the perilous time : and in the days of dearth they shall have enough.

20 As for the ungodly, they shall perish, and the enemies of the Lord shall consume as the fat of lambs : yea, even as the smoke, shall they consume away.

21 The ungodly borroweth, and payeth not again : but the righteous is merciful, and liberal.

22 Such as are blessed of God shall possess the land : and they that are cursed of him, shall be rooted out.

23 The Lord ordereth a good man's going : and maketh his way acceptable to
