At Matins all the service is of the Octave and only a Memorial of the Saint [Germanus]. At Lauds one Antiphon. At I. Ant. Thee they justly praise. [118].; at the Procession before Mass let not be made a Memorial of the Cross.

Thursday is of the Octave of Corpus Christi: with only a Memorial of the Saint [Nichomedes]. At 2. Vespers a Memorial of the Commemoration and of the Martyrs [Marcellinus and Peter]. 3
