Psalm 1



Blessèd is the man that hath not walked in the counsel of the ungodly,

nor stood in the way of <u>sin</u>ners, * and hath not sat in the <u>seat of</u> the scornful.

2 But his delight is in the law of the <u>LORD</u>; * and in his law will he exercise himself <u>day</u> and night.

3 And he shall be like a tree planted by the <u>wa</u>ter-side, * that will bring forth his <u>fruit in</u> due season.

4 His leaf also shall not <u>wi</u>ther; * and look, whatsoever he doeth, <u>it</u> shall prosper.

5 As for the ungodly, it is not so with <u>them</u>; * but they are like the chaff,

which the wind scattereth away from the <u>face of</u> the earth.

6 Therefore the ungodly shall not be able to stand in the <u>judgment</u>, * neither the sinners in the congregation <u>of</u> the righteous.

7 But the LORD knoweth the way of the <u>right</u>eous; * and the way of the un<u>godly</u> shall perish.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without <u>end</u>. Amen.



Why *do* the heathen so furiously <u>rage tog</u>ether? * and why do the people <u>imagine</u> a vain thing?

2 The kings of the earth stand up, and the rulers take <u>counsel tog</u>ether * against the LORD, and <u>against his</u> Anointed:

3 Let us break their <u>bonds a</u>sunder, * and cast <u>away</u> their cords from us.

4 He that dwelleth in heaven shall <u>laugh them to</u> scorn: * the Lord shall have <u>them in</u> derision.

5 Then shall he speak unto them $\underline{in his}$ wrath, * and vex them in $\underline{his sore}$ displeasure:

6 Yet have I <u>set my</u> King ***** upon my ho<u>ly hill</u> of Sion.

7 I will re<u>hearse the de</u>cree; * the LORD hath said unto me, Thou art my Son, this day <u>have I</u> begotten thee.

8 Desire of me, and I shall give thee the nations for <u>thine</u> <u>in</u>heritance, * and the utmost parts of the earth <u>for thy</u> possession.

9 Thou shalt bruise them with a <u>rod of</u> iron, * and break them in pieces like <u>a pot</u>ter's vessel.

10 Be wise now therefore, <u>O ye</u> kings; * be instructed, ye that <u>are judg</u>es of the earth.

11 Serve the <u>LORD in</u> fear, * and rejoice un<u>to him</u> with reverence.



12 Kiss the Son, lest he be angry, and so ye perish from the right way, if his wrath be kindled, yea <u>but a</u> little. *Blessèd are all they <u>that put</u> their trust in him.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Holy</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world with</u>out end. Amen.



LORD, *how* are they increased <u>that</u> trouble me! * many are they <u>that rise</u> against me.

2 Many one there be that say of <u>my</u> soul, * There is no help <u>for him</u> in his God.

3 But thou, O LORD, art my <u>de</u>fender; * thou art my worship, and the lift<u>er up</u> of my head.

4 I did call upon the LORD with <u>my</u> voice, * and he heard <u>me out of</u> his holy hill.

5 I laid me down and slept, and rose up <u>again;</u> * for <u>the LORD</u> sustained me.

6 I will not be afraid for ten thousands of <u>the</u> people, * that have set themselves <u>against</u> me round about.



7 Up, LORD, and help me, O <u>my</u> God, * for thou smitest all mine enemies upon the cheek-bone; thou hast broken the teeth <u>of the</u> ungodly.

8 Salvation belongeth unto <u>the</u> LORD; * and thy blessing is <u>upon</u> thy people.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

Psalm 4

Hear me when I call, O God of my <u>right</u>eousness: * thou hast set me at liberty when I was in trouble;

have mercy upon me, and hearken <u>un</u>to my prayer.

2 O ye sons of men, how long will ye blaspheme mine <u>hon</u>our, * and have such pleasure in vanity, and <u>seek after falsehood?</u>

3 Know this also,

that the LORD hath chosen to himself the man that is <u>god</u>ly; * when I call upon the LORD <u>he</u> will hear me.

4 Stand in awe, and sin <u>not;</u> * commune with your own heart, and in your <u>cham</u>ber, and be still.

5 Offer the sacrifice of <u>right</u>eousness, * and put your <u>trust</u> in the LORD.



6 There be many that <u>say</u>, * Who will <u>show</u> us any good?

7 LORD, lift thou <u>up</u> * the light of thy <u>countenance</u> upon us.

8 Thou hast put gladness in my <u>heart;</u> * yea, more than when their corn and <u>wine</u> and oil increase.

9 I will lay me down in peace, and take my <u>rest;</u> * for it is thou, LORD, only, that makest me <u>dwell</u> in safety.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world with</u>out end. Amen.




Ponder my words, O <u>LORD</u>, * consider my <u>me</u>ditation.

2 O hearken thou unto the voice of my calling, my King and my <u>God</u>: * for unto thee will I <u>make</u> my prayer.

3 My voice shalt thou hear be<u>times</u>, O LORD; * early in the morning will I direct my prayer unto thee, and <u>will</u> look up.

4 For thou art the God that hast no pleasure in <u>wickedness</u>; * neither shall any evil <u>dwell</u> with thee.



5 Such as be foolish shall not stand in thy <u>sight</u>; * for thou hatest all them that <u>work</u> iniquity.

6 Thou shalt destroy them that speak <u>lies</u>: * the LORD will abhor both the blood-thirsty and de<u>ceit</u>ful man.

7 But as for me, in the multitude of thy mercy I will come into thine house; *

and in thy fear will I worship toward thy holy temple.

8 Lead me, O LORD, in thy righteousness, because of mine <u>en</u>emies; * make thy way plain be<u>fore</u> my face.

9 For there is no faithfulness in their <u>mouth</u>; * their inward parts are <u>ve</u>ry wickedness.

10 Their throat is an open <u>sep</u>ulchre; * they flatter <u>with</u> their tongue.

11 Destroy thou them, O God;

let them perish through their own imaginations; *

cast them out in the multitude of their ungodliness;

for they have re<u>belled</u> against thee.

12 And let all them that put their trust in thee rejoice: * they shall ever be giving of thanks, because thou defendest them; they that love thy Name shall be joyful in thee;

13 For thou, LORD, wilt give thy blessing unto the <u>right</u>eous, * and with thy favourable kindness wilt thou defend him as <u>with</u> a shield.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without <u>end</u>. Amen.



O *LORD*, rebuke me not in thine <u>indig</u>nation, * neither chasten me <u>in thy</u> displeasure.

2 Have mercy upon me, O LORD, for <u>I am</u> weak; * O LORD, heal <u>me, for</u> my bones are vexed.

3 My soul also <u>is sore</u> troubled: * but, LORD, <u>how long wilt</u> thou punish me?

4 Turn thee, O LORD, and de<u>liver my</u> soul; * O save <u>me, for</u> thy mercy's sake.

5 For in death no <u>man re</u>membereth thee; ***** and who will give <u>thee thanks</u> in the pit?

6 I am weary <u>of my</u> groaning; * every night wash I my bed, and water <u>my couch</u> with my tears.

7 My beauty is gone for <u>very</u> trouble, * and worn away because <u>of all</u> mine enemies.

8 Away from me, all ye that <u>work in</u>iquity; * for the LORD hath heard <u>the voice of</u> my weeping.

9 The LORD hath heard <u>my pe</u>tition; * <u>the LORD will</u> receive my prayer.

10 All mine enemies shall be confounded, <u>and sore</u> vexed; * they shall be turned back, <u>and put to</u> shame suddenly.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Holy</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world with</u>out end. Amen.



O LORD my God, in thee have I put my <u>trust</u>: * save me from all them that persecute me, <u>and</u> deliver me;

2 Lest he devour my soul like a lion, and tear it in <u>pie</u>ces, * while <u>there</u> is none to help.

3 O LORD my God, if I have done any such <u>thing</u>; * or if there be any <u>wickedness</u> in my hands;

4 If I have rewarded evil unto him that dealt <u>friendly</u> with me; * (yea, I have delivered him that without any <u>cause is</u> mine enemy;)

5 Then let mine enemy persecute my soul, and <u>take</u> me; * yea, let him tread my life down upon the earth, and lay mine <u>hon</u>our in the dust.

6 Stand up, O LORD, in thy wrath,

and lift up thyself, because of the indignation of mine <u>en</u>emies; * arise up for me in the judgment that <u>thou hast</u> commanded.

7 And so shall the congregation of the peoples come ab<u>out</u> thee: * for their sakes therefore <u>lift up</u> thyself again.

8 The LORD shall judge the peoples:

give sentence with me, O LORD, according to my <u>right</u>eousness, * and according to the innocency <u>that</u> is in me.

9 O let the wickedness of the ungodly come to an <u>end;</u> * but <u>guide</u> thou the just.

10 For the righteous <u>God</u> * trieth the <u>very</u> hearts and reins.



11 My help cometh of <u>God</u>, ***** who preserveth <u>them that</u> are true of heart.

12 God is a righteous Judge, strong, and <u>patient;</u> * and God is pro<u>voked</u> every day.

13 If a man will not turn, he will whet his <u>sword</u>; * he hath bent his bow, and <u>made</u> it ready.

14 He hath prepared for him the instruments of <u>death</u>; * he ordaineth his arrows against the persecutors.

15 Behold, the ungodly travaileth with i<u>ni</u>quity; * he hath conceived mischief, and <u>brought</u> forth falsehood.

16 He hath graven and digged up a <u>pit</u>, * and is fallen himself into the destruction that he <u>made</u> for other.

17 For his travail shall come upon his own <u>head</u>, * and his wickedness shall fall <u>on</u> his own pate.

18 I will give thanks unto the LORD, according to his <u>right</u>eousness;* and I will praise the <u>Name of</u> the LORD Most High.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world with</u>out end. Amen.



O LORD our Governor, how excellent is thy Name in all the <u>world</u>; * thou that hast set thy glory above the heavens!

2 Out of the mouth of very babes and sucklings hast thou ordained strength,

because of thine enemies, *

that thou mightest still the enemy and the avenger.

3 When I consider thy heavens, even the work of thy <u>fing</u>ers; * the moon and the stars which <u>thou hast</u> ordained;

4 What is man, that thou art <u>mind</u>ful of him? * and the son of man, <u>that thou</u> visitest him?

5 Thou madest him lower than the <u>ang</u>els, ***** to crown him with <u>glory and</u> worship.

6 Thou makest him to have dominion of the works of thy <u>hands</u>; * and thou hast put all things in subjection <u>under</u> his feet:

7 All sheep and <u>ox</u>en; * yea, and the <u>beasts of</u> the field;

8 The fowls of the air, and the fishes of the <u>sea</u>; * and whatsoever walketh through the <u>paths of</u> the seas.

9 O LORD our <u>Go</u>vernor, * how excellent is thy <u>Name in</u> all the world!

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world without</u> end. Amen.



I will give thanks unto thee, O LORD, with my <u>whole</u> heart; * I will speak of all <u>thy mar</u>vellous works.

2 I will be glad and rejoice <u>in</u> thee; * yea, my songs will I make of thy Name, <u>O thou</u> Most Highest.

3 While mine enemies are driv<u>en</u> back, ***** they shall fall and per<u>ish at</u> thy presence.

4 For thou hast maintained my right and <u>my</u> cause; * thou art set in <u>the throne</u> that judgest right.

5 Thou hast rebuked the heathen, and destroyed the <u>ung</u>odly; ***** thou hast put out their name <u>for ever</u> and ever.

6 O thou enemy, thy destructions are come to a perpetual end; * even as the cities which thou hast destroyed,

whose memorial *is perished* with them.

7 But the LORD shall endure <u>for</u> ever; * he hath also prepared <u>his seat</u> for judgment.

8 For he shall judge the world <u>in</u> righteousness, * and minister true judg<u>ment unto</u> the people.

9 The LORD also will be a defence for the <u>oppressed</u>, ***** even a refuge in <u>due</u> time of trouble.

10 And they that know thy Name will put <u>their</u> trust in thee; * for thou, LORD, hast nev<u>er failed them</u> that seek thee.

11 O praise the LORD which dwelleth <u>in</u> Sion; * show the peo<u>ple of</u> his doings.

12 For when he maketh inquisition for blood, he <u>re</u>membereth them, * and forgetteth not the <u>com</u>plaint of the poor.



13 Have mercy upon me, O LORD;

consider the trouble which I suffer of them <u>that</u> hate me, * thou that liftest <u>me up from</u> the gates of death;

14 That I may show all thy praises within the gates of the daughter \underline{of} Sion: *

I will rejoice in thy salvation.

15 The heathen are sunk down in the pit that <u>they</u> made; ***** in the same net which they hid privily <u>is their</u> foot taken.

16 The LORD is known to exe<u>cute</u> judgment; * the ungodly is trapped in <u>the work of</u> his own hands.

17 The wicked shall be turned to <u>de</u>struction, * and all the people that forget God.

18 For the poor shall not alway be <u>forgotten</u>; * the patient abiding of the meek shall <u>not perish</u> for ever.

19 Up, LORD, and let not man have the up<u>per</u> hand; * let the heathen <u>be judged</u> in thy sight.

20 Put them in fear, <u>O</u> LORD, * that the heathen may know <u>themselves</u> to be but men.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Ho<u>ly</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world with</u>out end. Amen.



Why standest thou so far <u>off</u>, O LORD, * and hidest thy face in the needful <u>time</u> of trouble?

2 The ungodly, for his own lust, doth persecute the <u>poor</u>: * let them be taken in the crafty wiliness that <u>they have</u> imagined.

3 For the ungodly hath made boast of his own heart's de<u>sire</u>, ***** and speaketh good of the covetous, whom the <u>LORD</u> abhorreth.

4 The ungodly is so proud, that he careth not for <u>God</u>, * neither is God in <u>all</u> his thoughts.

5 His ways are alway <u>griev</u>ous; * thy judgments are far above out of his sight, and therefore defieth he all his enemies.

6 For he hath said in his heart, Tush, I shall never be cast <u>down</u>, * there shall no harm happen <u>un</u>to me.

7 His mouth is full of cursing, deceit, and <u>fraud;</u> * under his tongue is ungodli<u>ness</u> and vanity.


8 He sitteth lurking in the thievish corners of the <u>streets</u>, ***** and privily in his lurking dens doth he murder the innocent;

his eyes are set against the poor.

9 For he lieth waiting secretly; even as a lion lurketh he in his <u>den</u>, * that he may <u>ravish</u> the poor.

10 He doth ravish the <u>poor</u>, * when he getteth him <u>into</u> his net.

11 He falleth down, and <u>humb</u>leth himself, * that the congregation of the poor may fall into the <u>hands of</u> his captains.



12 He hath said in his heart, Tush, God hath for<u>got</u>ten; * he hideth away his face, and he will <u>nev</u>er see it.

13 Arise, O LORD God, and lift up thine <u>hand;</u> * forg<u>et not</u> the poor.

14 Wherefore should the wicked blaspheme <u>God</u>, * while he doth say in his heart, Tush, thou God <u>car</u>est not for it?

15 Surely thou hast <u>seen</u> it; * for thou beholdest ungodliness and wrong, that thou mayest take the matter <u>into</u> thy hand.

16 The poor committeth himself unto <u>thee</u>; * for thou art the helper <u>of</u> the friendless.

17 Break thou the power of the ungodly and malicious; * search out his ungodliness, until thou find none.

18 The LORD is King for ever and <u>ever</u>, * and the heathen are perished <u>out of</u> the land.

19 LORD, thou hast heard the desire of the <u>poor</u>; * thou preparest their heart, and <u>thine</u> ear hearkeneth;

20 To help the fatherless and poor unto their <u>right</u>, * that the man of the earth be no more exalted against them.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without <u>end</u>. Amen.



In the LORD put I my <u>trust;</u> * how say ye then to my soul, that she should flee as a <u>bird</u> unto the hill?

2 For lo, the ungodly bend their bow, and make ready their arrows within the <u>qui</u>ver, * that they may privily shoot at <u>them which</u> are true of heart.

3 If the foundations be des<u>troyed</u>, ***** what <u>can</u> the righteous do?

4 The LORD is in his holy <u>temple</u>; * the LORD'S seat <u>is</u> in heaven.

5 His eyes consider the <u>poor</u>, * and his eyelids try the <u>chil</u>dren of men.

6 The LORD approveth the <u>right</u>eous: * but the ungodly, and him that delighteth in wickedness, <u>doth</u> his soul abhor.

7 Upon the ungodly he shall rain snares, fire and brimstone, storm and <u>tempest</u>: * this shall be their <u>por</u>tion to drink.

8 For the righteous LORD loveth <u>right</u>eousness; * his countenance will behold the <u>thing</u> that is just.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world <u>without end.</u> Amen.



Help *me*, LORD, for there is not one <u>godly man</u> left; * for the faithful are minished from among <u>the child</u>ren of men.

2 They talk of vanity every one <u>with his</u> neighbour; * they do but flatter with their lips, and dissemble in their double heart.

3 The LORD shall root out all de<u>ceitful</u> lips, * and the tongue <u>that speak</u>eth proud things;

4 Which have said, With our tongue will <u>we prevail</u>; * we are they that ought to speak; who <u>is lord</u> over us?

5 Now, for the comfortless troubles' sake <u>of the</u> needy, ***** and because of the <u>deep sighing</u> of the poor,

6 I will up, <u>saith the</u> LORD; * and will help every one from him that swelleth against him, and <u>will set</u> him at rest.

7 The words of the <u>LORD are</u> pure words; * even as the silver which from the earth is tried, and purified sev<u>en times</u> in the fire.

8 Thou shalt keep <u>them, O</u> LORD; * thou shalt preserve them from this gen<u>eration</u> for ever.

9 The ungodly walk on <u>every</u> side: * when they are exalted, the children of men <u>are put</u> to rebuke.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Holy</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.



How long wilt thou forget me, O LORD; for <u>ev</u>er? * how long wilt thou <u>hide</u> thy face from me?

2 How long shall I seek counsel in my soul, and be so vexed in my <u>heart</u>? * how long shall mine enemy <u>tri</u>umph over me?

3 Consider, and hear me, O LORD my <u>God</u>; * lighten mine eyes, that I <u>sleep</u> not in death;

4 Lest mine enemy say, I have prevailed against him: * for if I be cast down, they that trouble me <u>will</u> rejoice at it.

5 But my trust is in thy <u>mer</u>cy, * and my heart is joyful in <u>thy</u> salvation.

6 I will sing of the LORD, because he hath dealt so lovingly with <u>me</u>; * yea, I will praise the Name of the <u>Lord</u> Most Highest.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world with</u>out end. Amen.



The fool hath said in his <u>heart</u>, * There <u>is</u> no God.

2 They are corrupt, and become abominable in their <u>doings</u>; * there is none that doeth good, <u>no</u> not one.



3 The LORD looked down from heaven upon the children of <u>men</u>, * to see if there were any that would understand, and <u>seek after God</u>.

4 But they are all gone out of the way, they are altogether become <u>abo</u>minable; * there is none that doeth good, <u>no</u> not one.

5 Have they no knowledge, that they are all such workers of <u>mis</u>chief, * eating up my people as it were bread, and call not up<u>on</u> the LORD?

6 There were they brought in great fear, even where no fear <u>was;</u> * for God is in the generation <u>of</u> the righteous.

7 As for you, ye have made a mock at the counsel of the <u>poor</u>; * because he putteth his <u>trust in</u> the LORD.

8 Who shall give salvation unto Israel out of <u>Si</u>on? * When the LORD turneth the captivity of his people, then shall Jacob rejoice, and Israel <u>shall</u> be glad.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without <u>end</u>. Amen.



LORD, who shall dwell in thy <u>tabernacle</u>? * or who shall rest up<u>on thy</u> holy hill?

2 Even he that leadeth an uncorrupt <u>life</u>, * and doeth the thing which is right, and speaketh the <u>truth from</u> his heart.

3 He that hath used no deceit in his tongue, nor done evil to his <u>neighbour</u>, * and hath not <u>slandered his</u> neighbour.

4 He that setteth not by himself, but is lowly in his own <u>eyes</u>, * and maketh much of <u>them that</u> fear the LORD.

5 He that sweareth unto his neighbour, and disappointeth him <u>not</u>, * though it were to <u>his own</u> hindrance.

6 He that hath not given his money upon <u>us</u>ury, * nor taken reward against the innocent.

7 Whoso doeth these <u>things</u> * <u>shall ne</u>ver fall.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world without</u> end. Amen.



Preserve me, <u>O</u> God; * for in <u>thee have</u> I put my trust.

2 O my soul, thou hast said unto <u>the</u> LORD, * Thou art my God; I have no <u>good like</u> unto thee.

3 All my delight is upon the saints that are in <u>the</u> earth, * and upon such as <u>excel</u> in virtue.

4 But they that run after anoth<u>er</u> god * <u>shall have</u> great trouble.

5 Their drink-offerings of blood will I <u>not</u> offer, * neither make mention of <u>their names</u> within my lips.

6 The LORD himself is the portion of mine inheritance, and of <u>my</u> cup; * <u>thou shalt</u> maintain my lot.

7 The lot is fallen unto me in a <u>fair</u> ground; * yea, I have <u>a good</u>ly heritage.

8 I will thank the LORD for giving <u>me</u> warning; * my reins also chasten <u>me in the</u> night season.

9 I have set the LORD alway <u>be</u>fore me; * for he is on my right hand, <u>therefore</u> I shall not fall.

10 Wherefore my heart is glad, and my glory <u>rejoiceth</u>: * my flesh <u>also</u> shall rest in hope.

11 For why? thou shalt not leave my soul <u>in</u> hell; * neither shalt thou suffer thy Holy One <u>to see</u> corruption.



12 Thou shalt show me the path of life:

in thy presence is the fulness <u>of</u> joy, ***** and at thy right hand there <u>is pleasure</u> for evermore.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be,

world without end. Amen.



Hear the right, O LORD, consider <u>my complaint</u>, * and hearken unto my prayer, that goeth <u>not out</u> of feigned lips.

2 Let my sentence come forth <u>from thy</u> presence; * and let thine eyes look upon <u>the thing that</u> is equal.

3 Thou hast proved and visited mine heart in the night season; thou hast tried me, and shalt find no <u>wickedness</u> in me; * for I am utterly purposed that <u>my mouth</u> shall not offend.

4 As for the <u>works of</u> men, *

by the word of thy lips I have kept me from the ways <u>of the</u> destroyer.

5 O hold thou up my goings <u>in thy</u> paths, * that <u>my foot</u>steps slip not.

6 I have called upon thee, O God, for <u>thou shalt</u> hear me: * incline thine ear to me, and heark<u>en un</u>to my words.



7 Show thy marvellous loving-kindness,

8 Keep me as the apple <u>of an</u> eye; * hide me under <u>the sha</u>dow of thy wings,

9 From the ung<u>odly, that</u> trouble me; * mine enemies compass me round about, <u>to take</u> away my soul.

10 They are inclosed in <u>their own</u> fat, * and their <u>mouth speak</u>eth proud things.

11 They lie waiting in our way on <u>every</u> side, * watching to cast <u>us down</u> to the ground;

12 Like as a lion that is greedy <u>of his prey</u>, ***** and as it were a lion's whelp lurking <u>in se</u>cret places.

13 Up, LORD, disappoint him, and <u>cast him</u> down; * deliver my soul from the ungod<u>ly, by</u> thine own sword;

14 Yea, by thy hand, O LORD; from the men of the <u>evil</u> world; * which have their portion in this life,

whose bellies thou fillest with thy hid treasure.

15 They have children at <u>their de</u>sire, ***** and leave the rest of <u>their sub</u>stance for their babes.

16 But as for me, I shall behold thy <u>presence in</u> righteousness; ***** and when I awake up after thy likeness, <u>I shall</u> be satisfied.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Ho</u>ly Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world with</u>out end. Amen.



I will love thee, O LORD, my <u>strength</u>. * The LORD is my stony <u>rock, and</u> my defence;

2 My Saviour, my God, and my might, in whom I will <u>trust</u>; * my buckler, the horn also of my salvation, <u>and my</u> refuge.

3 I will call upon the LORD, which is worthy to be <u>praised</u>; * so shall I be <u>safe from mine</u> enemies.

4 The sorrows of death <u>compassed me</u>, ***** and the overflowings of ungodliness <u>made me</u> afraid.

5 The pains of hell came ab<u>out</u> me; * the snares of <u>death over</u>took me.

6 In my trouble I called upon the <u>LORD</u>, * and com<u>plained un</u>to my God:

7 So he heard my voice out of his holy <u>temple</u>, * and my complaint came before him; it entered even <u>into</u> his ears.



8 The earth trembled and quaked, *

the very foundations also of the hills shook, and were removed,

because he was wroth.

9 There went a smoke out <u>in his</u> presence, *

and a consuming fire out of his mouth, so that coals <u>were kin</u>dled at it.

10 He bowed the heavens also, <u>and came</u> down, * and it <u>was dark</u> under his feet.



11 He rode upon the Cherubim, <u>and did</u> fly; * he came flying upon <u>the wings</u> of the wind.

12 He made darkness his <u>secret</u> place, * his pavilion round about him with dark water, and <u>thick clouds</u> to cover him.

13 At the brightness of his presence his <u>clouds re</u>moved; * <u>hailstones</u> and coals of fire.

14 The LORD also thundered out of heaven, and the Highest <u>gave his</u> thunder; * <u>hailstones</u> and coals of fire.

15 He sent out his <u>arrows</u>, and scattered them; * he cast forth light<u>nings</u>, and destroyed them.

16 The springs of waters were seen, and the foundations of the round world were discovered, * at thy chiding, O LORD,

at the blasting of the breath <u>of thy</u> displeasure.

17 He sent down from on <u>high to</u> fetch me, ***** and took me out <u>of many</u> waters.

18 He delivered me from my strongest enemy, and from <u>them which</u> hate me; * for they were <u>too mighty</u> for me.

19 They came upon me in the day <u>of my</u> trouble; ***** but the LORD <u>was my</u> upholder.

20 He brought me forth also into a <u>place of</u> liberty; * he brought me forth, even because he had <u>a fa</u>vour unto me.



21 The *LORD* rewarded me after my right<u>eous</u> dealing, * according to the cleanness of <u>my hands did</u> he recompense me.

22 Because I have kept the ways of <u>the</u> LORD, * and have not forsaken <u>my God</u>, <u>as</u> the wicked doth.

23 For I have an eye unto all <u>his</u> laws, ***** and will not cast out his <u>command</u>ments from me.

24 I was also uncorrupt <u>be</u>fore him, * and <u>eschewed mine</u> own wickedness.

25 Therefore the LORD rewarded me after my right<u>eous</u> dealing, * and according unto the cleanness of <u>my hands in</u> his eyesight.

26 With the holy thou shalt <u>be</u> holy, ***** and with a perfect man <u>thou shalt</u> be perfect.

27 With the clean thou shalt <u>be</u> clean, * and with the froward <u>thou shalt</u> be froward.

28 For thou shalt save the people that are in <u>ad</u>versity, and shalt bring down <u>the high</u> looks of the proud.

29 Thou also shalt light <u>my</u> candle; * the LORD my God shall make <u>my dark</u>ness to be light.

30 For in thee I shall discomfit an host <u>of</u> men, * and with the help of my God I shall <u>leap ov</u>er the wall.

31 The way of God is an undefil<u>ed</u> way: * the word of the LORD also is tried in the fire;

he is the defender of all them that put their trust in him.

32 For who is God, but <u>the</u> LORD? * or who hath an<u>y strength</u>, except our God?



33 It is God that girdeth me with strength <u>of</u> war, ***** and mak<u>eth my</u> way perfect.

34 He maketh my feet <u>like</u> harts' feet, * <u>and setteth</u> me up on high.

35 He teacheth mine hands <u>to</u> fight, * and mine arms shall <u>bend even</u> a bow of steel.



36 Thou hast given me the defence of thy sal<u>va</u>tion; * thy right hand also shall hold me up,

and thy loving cor<u>rection</u> shall make me great.

37 Thou shalt make room enough under me for to <u>go</u>, * that my <u>foot</u>steps shall not slide.

38 I will follow upon mine enemies, and over<u>take</u> them; * neither will I turn again till I <u>have</u> destroyed them.

39 I will smite them, that they shall not be able to <u>stand</u>, * but fall <u>un</u>der my feet.

40 Thou hast girded me with strength unto the <u>bat</u>tle; * thou shalt throw down mine <u>enemies</u> under me.

41 Thou hast made mine enemies also to turn their backs up<u>on</u> me, ***** and I shall destroy <u>them</u> that hate me.

42 They shall cry, but there shall be none to <u>help</u> them; * yea, even unto the LORD shall they cry,

but he <u>shall</u> not hear them.



43 I will beat them as small as the dust before the <u>wind</u>: * I will cast them out as the <u>clay</u> in the streets.

44 Thou shalt deliver me from the strivings of the <u>people</u>, ***** and thou shalt make me the head of the nations;

a people whom I have not known shall serve me.

45 As soon as they hear of me, they shall ob<u>ey</u> me; * the strangers shall feign o<u>be</u>dience unto me.

46 The strangers shall <u>fail</u>, * and come trembling <u>out of</u> their strongholds.

47 The LORD liveth; and blessèd be my strong <u>help</u>er, * and praised be the God of <u>my</u> salvation;

48 Even the God that seeth that I be av<u>enged</u>, ***** and subdueth the <u>people</u> unto me.

49 It is he that delivereth me from my cruel enemies, and setteth me up above mine <u>adversaries</u>: * thou shalt rid me <u>from</u> the wicked man.

50 For this cause will I give thanks unto thee, O LORD, among the <u>Gen</u>tiles, * and sing praises unto thy Name.

51 Great prosperity giveth he unto his <u>King</u>, * and showeth loving-kindness unto David his anointed, and unto his <u>seed</u> for evermore.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

9 The fear of the LORD is clean, and en<u>dureth for</u> ever; * the judgments of the LORD are true, and righteous <u>altog</u>ether.

10 More to be desired are they than gold, <u>yea, than</u> much fine gold; * sweeter also than honey, <u>and the</u> honeycomb.



11 Moreover, by <u>them is thy</u> servant taught; * and in keeping of them <u>there is</u> great reward.

12 Who can tell how <u>oft he off</u>endeth? * O cleanse thou me <u>from my</u> secret faults.

13 Keep thy servant also from presumptuous sins,

lest they get the dominion over me; *

so shall I be undefiled, and innocent from the great offence.

14 Let the words of my mouth, and the meditation of my heart, be alway ac<u>ceptable</u> in thy sight, *

O LORD, my strength and <u>my re</u>deemer.

6 But as for me, I am a worm, and no <u>man</u>; * a very scorn of men, and the outcast <u>of</u> the people.


7 All they that see me laugh me to <u>scorn</u>; * they shoot out their lips, and <u>shake their</u> heads, saying,

29 All such as be fat up<u>on</u> earth * <u>have eaten</u>, and worshipped.





9 My heart hath talked of thee, Seek ye my <u>face</u>: * Thy face, LORD, <u>will</u> I seek.

10 O hide not thou thy <u>face</u> from me, * nor cast thy servant away <u>in</u> displeasure.

11 Thou hast been my <u>suc</u>cour; * leave me not, neither forsake me, O God of <u>my</u> salvation.

12 When my father and my mother for<u>sake</u> me, * the LORD <u>taketh</u> me up.

13 Teach me thy way, O <u>LORD</u>, * and lead me in the right way, be<u>cause of</u> mine enemies.

14 Deliver me not over into the will of mine <u>adversaries</u>: * for there are false witnesses risen up against me,

and such as speak wrong.



15 I should utterly have fainted, *

but that I believe verily to see the goodness of the LORD in the \underline{land} of the living.

16 O tarry thou the LORD'S <u>lei</u>sure; *be strong, and he shall comfort thine heart; and put thou thy <u>trust in</u> the LORD.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without <u>end</u>. Amen.

Psalm 28



Unto thee will I cry, O LORD, my <u>strength</u>: * think no scorn of me;

lest, if thou make as though thou hearest not,

I become like them that go <u>down</u> into the pit.

2 Hear the voice of my humble petitions, when I cry unto <u>thee</u>; * when I hold up my hands towards the mercy-seat of thy <u>ho</u>ly temple.

3 O pluck me not away,

neither destroy me with the ungodly and wicked <u>do</u>ers, * which speak friendly to their neighbours,

but imagine <u>mis</u>chief in their hearts.

4 Reward them according to their <u>deeds</u>, * and according to the wickedness of their <u>own</u> inventions.



5 Recompense them after the work of their <u>hands</u>; * pay them <u>that</u> they have deserved.

6 For they regard not in their mind the works of the LORD, nor the operation of his <u>hands</u>; * therefore shall he break them down, <u>and</u> not build them up.

7 Praised be the <u>LORD;</u> * for he hath heard the voice of my <u>humble</u> petitions.

8 The LORD is my strength, and my shield; my heart hath trusted in him, and I am <u>helped</u>; * therefore my heart danceth for joy, and in my song <u>will</u> I praise him.

9 The LORD is my <u>strength</u>, * and he is the wholesome defence of <u>his</u> anointed.

10 O save thy people, and give thy blessing unto thine in<u>he</u>ritance: * feed them, and set them <u>up</u> for ever.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world with</u>out end. Amen.

Psalm 29

Ascribe unto the LORD, <u>O ye</u> mighty, * ascribe unto the LORD <u>worship</u> and strength.

the voice of the LORD is mighty in <u>oper</u>ation; * the voice of the <u>LORD is a</u> glorious voice.

5 The voice of the LORD <u>breaketh the</u> cedar-trees; * yea, the LORD breaketh the <u>cedars of</u> Lebanon.

6 He maketh them also to <u>skip like</u> a calf; * Lebanon also, and Sirion, <u>like a young</u> unicorn.

7 The voice of the LORD divideth the flames of fire; the voice of the LORD <u>shaketh the</u> wilderness; * yea, the LORD shaketh the <u>wilderness of</u> Kadesh.

8 The voice of the LORD maketh the hinds to bring forth young, and strippeth <u>bare the</u> forests: * in his temple doth every thing <u>speak of his</u> honour.

9 The LORD sitteth ab<u>ove the</u> water-flood, * and the LORD remaineth a <u>King for</u> ever.

10 The LORD shall give strength un<u>to his</u> people; * the LORD shall give his people the <u>blessing</u> of peace.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Holy</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world without</u> end. Amen.

Psalm 30



I *will* magnify thee, O LORD; for thou hast set <u>me</u> up, * and not made my foes <u>to tri</u>umph over me.

7 Thou didst turn <u>thy</u> face from me, * <u>and I</u> was troubled.

8 Then cried I unto thee, <u>O</u> LORD; * and gat me to <u>my LORD</u> right humbly.

9 What profit is there in <u>my</u> blood, * when I go down into the pit?

10 Shall the dust give thanks un<u>to</u> thee? * <u>or shall it</u> declare thy truth?

11 Hear, O LORD, and have mercy <u>up</u>on me; * LORD, <u>be thou</u> my helper.



12 Thou hast turned my heaviness in<u>to</u> joy; ***** thou hast put off my sackcloth, and gird<u>ed me</u> with gladness:

13 Therefore shall every good man sing of thy praise with<u>out</u> ceasing. * O my God, I will give thanks un<u>to thee</u> for ever.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be,

world without end. Amen.

Psalm 31



In thee, O LORD, have I put my trust; let me never be put to con<u>fus</u>ion; * deliver me <u>in thy</u> righteousness.

6 Into thy hands I commend my <u>spi</u>rit; * for thou hast redeemed me, O <u>LORD, thou</u> God of truth.



7 I have hated them that hold of lying <u>van</u>ities, * and my trust hath <u>been in</u> the LORD.

8 I will be glad and rejoice in thy <u>mer</u>cy; * for thou hast considered my trouble, and hast known my <u>soul in</u> <u>ad</u>versities.

9 Thou hast not shut me up into the hand of the <u>en</u>emy; * but hast set my <u>feet in a</u> large room.

10 Have mercy upon me, O LORD, for I am in <u>trou</u>ble, * and mine eye is consumed for very heaviness;

yea, my soul and my body.

11 For my life is waxen old with <u>hea</u>viness, ***** and my <u>years with</u> mourning.

12 My strength faileth me, because of mine in<u>i</u>quity, * and my <u>bones are</u> consumed.

13 I became a reproach among all mine enemies, but especially among my <u>neighbours</u>; * and they of mine acquaintance were afraid of me; and they that did see me without, conveyed themselves from me.

14 I am clean forgotten as a dead man out of <u>mind</u>; * I am become like a <u>broken</u> vessel.

15 For I have heard the blasphemy of the multitude, and fear is on every <u>side</u>; * while they conspire together against me,

and take their counsel to take away my life.

16 But my hope hath been in thee, O <u>LORD;</u> * I have said, <u>Thou art</u> my God.



17 My times are in thy hand;

deliver me from the hand of mine <u>en</u>emies, * and from <u>them that</u> persecute me.

18 Show thy servant the light of thy <u>count</u>enance, * and save me <u>for thy</u> mercy's sake.

19 Let me not be confounded, O LORD, for I have called up<u>on</u> thee; * let the ungodly be put to confusion,

and be put to silence in the grave.

20 Let the lying lips be put to <u>sil</u>ence, * which cruelly, disdainfully, and despitefully speak against the righteous.

21 O how plentiful is thy goodness,

which thou hast laid up for them that <u>fear</u> thee, *

and that thou hast prepared for them that put their trust in thee,

even before the sons of men!

22 Thou shalt hide them in the covert of thine own presence from the plottings of \underline{men} : *

thou shalt keep them secretly in thy tabernacle <u>from the</u> strife of tongues.

23 Thanks be to the <u>LORD;</u> * for he hath showed me marvellous great kindness <u>in a strong</u> city.

24 But in my haste I <u>said</u>, * I am cast out of the <u>sight of</u> thine eyes.

25 Nevertheless, thou heardest the voice of my <u>prayer</u>, * when I <u>cried un</u>to thee.



26 O love the LORD, all ye his <u>saints</u>; * for the LORD preserveth them that are faithful, and plenteously re<u>wardeth the proud</u> doer.

27 Be strong, and he shall establish your <u>heart</u>, * all ye that put your <u>trust in</u> the LORD.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world without</u> end. Amen.

Psalm 32



Blessèd is he whose unrighteousness <u>is forg</u>iven, * and <u>whose sin</u> is covered.

2 Blessèd is the man unto whom the LORD im<u>puteth no</u> sin, * and in <u>whose spirit</u> there is no guile.

3 For whilst I <u>held my</u> tongue, * my bones consumed away through <u>my daily</u> complaining.

4 For thy hand was heavy upon me <u>day and</u> night, ***** and my moisture was like <u>the drought</u> in summer.

5 I acknowledged my sin <u>unto</u> thee; ***** and mine unrighteous<u>ness have</u> I not hid.

6 I said, I will confess my sins <u>unto the</u> LORD; * and so thou forgavest <u>the wickedness</u> of my sin.



7 For this shall every one that is godly make his prayer unto thee,

in a time when thou <u>mayest be</u> found; * surely the great water-floods <u>shall not</u> come nigh him.

8 Thou art a place to hide me in;

thou shalt preserve <u>me from</u> trouble; * thou shalt compass me about <u>with songs of</u> deliverance.

9 I will inform thee, and teach thee in the way wherein <u>thou shalt</u> go; * and I <u>will guide</u> thee with mine eye.

10 Be ye not like to horse and mule, which have no <u>under</u>standing; * whose mouths must be held with bit and bridle,

else they will not obey thee.

11 Great plagues re<u>main for the ung</u>odly; * but whoso putteth his trust in the LORD, mercy embraceth him on every side.

12 Be glad, O ye righteous, and rejoice <u>in the</u> LORD; * and be joyful, <u>all ye that</u> are true of heart.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Holy</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world with</u>out end. Amen.



Rejoice in the LORD, <u>O ye</u> righteous; * for it becometh well the j<u>ust to be</u> thankful.



2 <u>Praise the</u> LORD with harp; * sing praises unto him with the lute, and <u>instrument of</u> ten strings.

8 Let all the <u>earth fear</u> the LORD: * stand in awe of him, all ye that <u>dwell in</u> the world.

9 For he <u>spake</u>, <u>and</u> it was done; * he commanded, <u>and it</u> stood fast.

10 The LORD bringeth the counsel of the <u>heathen</u> to nought, * and maketh the devices of the people to be of none effect, and casteth out the <u>counsels of</u> princes.

11 The counsel of the LORD shall end<u>ure for</u> ever, ***** and the thoughts of his heart from generation to <u>gene</u>ration.

12 Blessèd are the people whose God is the Lord JEHOVAH; * and blessèd are the folk that he hath chosen to him,

to <u>be his in</u>heritance.



13 The LORD looketh down from heaven, and beholdeth all the <u>children</u> of men; * from the habitation of his dwelling, he considereth all them that dwell on the earth.

14 He fashioneth <u>all the</u> hearts of them, ***** and under<u>standeth</u> all their works.

15 There is no king that can be saved by the <u>multitude</u> of an host; * neither is any mighty man de<u>livered by</u> much strength.

16 A horse is counted but a vain <u>thing to</u> save a man; * neither shall he deliver any man <u>by his</u> great strength.

17 Behold, the eye of the LORD is up<u>on them that</u> fear him, * and upon them that put their <u>trust in his</u> mercy;

18 To de<u>liver their</u> soul from death, * and to feed them <u>in the</u> time of dearth.

19 Our soul hath patiently <u>tarried</u> for the LORD; * for he is our <u>help and</u> our shield.

20 For our <u>heart shall rejoice</u> in him; * because we have <u>hoped in his</u> holy Name.

21 Let thy merciful kindness, O LORD, <u>be up</u>on us, * like as we do <u>put our</u> trust in thee.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Holy</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world without</u> end. Amen.

Psalm 34



I will alway give thanks unto the <u>LORD;</u> * his praise shall <u>ever</u> be in my mouth.

2 My soul shall make her boast in the <u>LORD</u>; * the humble shall hear there<u>of</u>, and be glad.

3 O praise the LORD with <u>me</u>, * and let us magnify his <u>Name</u> together.

4 I sought the LORD, and he <u>heard</u> me; * yea, he delivered me <u>out</u> of all my fear.

5 They had an eye unto him, and were <u>light</u>ened; * and their <u>faces</u> were not ashamed.

6 Lo, the poor crieth, and the LORD <u>hear</u>eth him; * yea, and saveth him out of <u>all</u> his troubles.

7 The angel of the LORD tarrieth round about them that <u>fear</u> him, * <u>and</u> delivereth them.

8 O taste, and see, how gracious the <u>LORD</u> is: * blessèd is the man that <u>trust</u>eth in him.

9 O fear the LORD, ye that are his <u>saints;</u> * for they that <u>fear him</u> lack nothing.

10 The lions do lack, and suffer <u>hung</u>er; * but they who seek the LORD shall want no manner of <u>thing</u> that is good.

11 Come, ye children, and hearken unto <u>me</u>; * I will teach you the <u>fear</u> of the LORD.



12 What man is he that lusteth to <u>live</u>, * and would <u>fain</u> see good days?

13 Keep thy tongue from <u>ev</u>il, * and thy lips, <u>that</u> they speak no guile.

14 Eschew evil, and do <u>good</u>; * seek <u>peace</u>, and ensue it.

15 The eyes of the LORD are over the <u>right</u>eous, * and his ears are open <u>un</u>to their prayers.

16 The countenance of the LORD is against them that do <u>ev</u>il, ***** to root out the remembrance of <u>them</u> from the earth.

17 The righteous cry, and the LORD <u>hear</u>eth them, * and delivereth them out of <u>all</u> their troubles.

18 The LORD is nigh unto them that are of a contrite <u>heart</u>, * and will save such as be of an <u>hum</u>ble spirit.

19 Great are the troubles of the <u>right</u>eous; * but the LORD de<u>livereth</u> him out of all.

20 He keepeth all his <u>bones</u>, ***** so that not one of <u>them</u> is broken.

21 But misfortune shall slay the un<u>godly;</u> * and they that hate the righteous <u>shall</u> be desolate.

22 The LORD delivereth the souls of his <u>ser</u>vants; * and all they that put their trust in him shall <u>not</u> be destitute.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world <u>with</u>out end. Amen.

Psalm 35



Plead thou my cause, O LORD, with them that <u>strive</u> with me, * and fight thou against them that <u>fight</u> against me.

2 Lay hand upon the shield and <u>buck</u>ler, ***** and stand <u>up</u> to help me.

4 Let them be confounded, and put to shame, that seek after my soul; *

let them be turned back, and brought to confusion, that imagine <u>mischief</u> for me.

5 Let them be as the dust before the <u>wind</u>, ***** and the angel <u>of the</u> LORD scattering them.

6 Let their way be dark and <u>slip</u>pery, ***** and let the angel of the <u>LORD</u> pursue them.

7 For they have privily laid their net to destroy me without a <u>cause</u>; * yea, even without a cause have they made a <u>pit for</u> my soul.

8 Let a sudden destruction come upon him unawares, and his net that he hath laid privily catch him<u>self;</u> * that he may fall into <u>his</u> own mischief.

9 And my soul shall be joyful in the <u>LORD;</u> * it shall rejoice in <u>his</u> salvation.

10 All my bones shall say, LORD, who is like unto thee, who deliverest the poor from him that is too <u>strong</u> for him; * yea, the poor, and him that is in misery, from <u>him</u> that spoileth him?

11 False witnesses did rise <u>up</u>: * they laid to my charge things that <u>I</u> knew not.

12 They rewarded me evil for <u>good</u>, * to the great discomfort <u>of</u> my soul.

13 Nevertheless, when they were sick, I put on sackcloth, and humbled my soul with <u>fast</u>ing; * and my prayer shall turn into <u>mine</u> own bosom.

14 I behaved myself as though it had been my friend or my <u>bro</u>ther; * I went heavily, as one that mourneth <u>for</u> his mother.

15 But in mine adversity they rejoiced, and gathered themselves together; *
yea, the very abjects came together against me unawares, making mouths at me, <u>and</u> ceased not.

16 With the flatterers were busy <u>mock</u>ers, * who gnashed upon me <u>with</u> their teeth.

17 Lord, how long wilt thou look up<u>on</u> this? *O deliver my soul from the calamities which they bring on me, and my darling <u>from</u> the lions.

18 So will I give thee thanks in the great congregation; * I will praise thee among much people.

19 O let not them that are mine enemies triumph over me un<u>god</u>ly; * neither let them wink with their eyes, that hate me with<u>out</u> a cause.

20 And why? their communing is not for <u>peace</u>; * but they imagine deceitful words against them that are quiet <u>in</u> the land.



21 They gaped upon me with their mouths, and <u>said</u>, * Fie on thee!

we saw it with our eyes.

22 This thou hast seen, O LORD; * hold not thy tongue then; go not far from me, O Lord.

23 Awake, and stand up to judge my <u>qua</u>rrel; * avenge thou my cause, my <u>God and</u> my Lord.

24 Judge me, O LORD my God, according to thy <u>right</u>eousness; * and let them not triumph <u>ov</u>er me.

25 Let them not say in their hearts, There! there! so would we <u>have</u> it; *

neither let them say, We have devoured him.

26 Let them be put to confusion and shame together, that rejoice at my <u>trou</u>ble; * let them be clothed with rebuke and dishonour, that boast them<u>selves</u> against me.

27 Let them be glad and rejoice, that favour my righteous <u>deal</u>ing; * yea, let them say alway, Blessèd be the LORD,

who hath pleasure in the prosperity of his servant.

28 And as for my tongue, it shall be talking of thy <u>right</u>eousness, * and of thy praise, <u>all the</u> day long.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without <u>end</u>. Amen.

Psalm 36



My heart showeth me the wickedness of the un<u>godly</u>, * that there is no fear of <u>God</u> before his eyes.

5 Thy mercy, O LORD, reacheth unto the <u>heav</u>ens, * and thy faithfulness <u>un</u>to the clouds.

6 Thy righteousness standeth like the strong <u>moun</u>tains: * thy judgments are <u>like</u> the great deep.

7 Thou, LORD, shalt save both man and beast:

how excellent is thy mercy, O <u>God</u>! * and the children of men shall put their trust under the <u>sha</u>dow of thy wings.

8 They shall be satisfied with the plenteousness of thy <u>house</u>; * and thou shalt give them drink of thy pleasures, as <u>out of</u> the river.

9 For with thee is the well of <u>life;</u> * and in thy <u>light</u> shall we see light.

10 O continue forth thy loving-kindness unto them that $\underline{\text{know}}$ thee, * and thy righteousness unto them <u>that</u> are true of heart.

11 O let not the foot of pride come against me; * and let not the hand of the ungodly cast me down.



12 There are they fallen, all that work <u>wi</u>ckedness; * they are cast down, and shall not be <u>able</u> to stand.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world with</u>out end. Amen.

11 But the meek-spirited shall possess <u>the</u> earth, ***** and shall be refreshed in <u>the mul</u>titude of peace.



12 The *un*godly seeketh <u>counsel against</u> the just, * and gnasheth up-|on him|with his|teeth.

13 The Lord shall <u>laugh him</u> to scorn; * for he hath seen that his | day is | *com*- | ing.

14 The ungodly have drawn out the <u>sword</u>, <u>and have</u> bent their bow, * to cast down the poor and needy,

and to slay such as be | upright | in their | ways.

15 Their sword shall go <u>through their</u> own heart, ***** and their bow | shall be | *bro-* | ken.

16 A small thing <u>that the</u> righteous hath, * is better than great | riches | of the un- | godly.

17 For the arms of the ungodly <u>shall be</u> broken, * and the | LORD up- | holdeth the | righteous.

18 The LORD knoweth the <u>days of the</u> godly; * and their inheritance shall en- | dure for | *ev*- | er.



19 They shall not be confounded in the <u>peril</u>ous time; * and in the days of dearth | they shall | have e- | nough.

20 As for the ungodly, they shall perish,

and the enemies of the LORD shall con<u>sume as the</u> fat of lambs: * yea, even as the smoke shall | they con- | sume a- | way.

21 The ungodly borroweth, and <u>payeth</u> not again; * but the righteous is | merci- | ful and | liberal.

22 Such as are blessed of God, <u>shall pos</u>sess the land; * and they that are cursed of him, | shall be | rooted | out.



23 The *LORD* ordereth a <u>good man's</u> going, * and maketh his way accep<u>table</u> to himself.

24 Though he fall, he shall not be <u>cast</u> away; * for the LORD <u>upholdeth</u> him with his hand.

25 I have been young, and <u>now am</u> old; * and yet saw I never the righteous forsaken, nor his <u>seed begging</u> their bread.

26 The righteous is ever merci<u>ful, and</u> lendeth; * and <u>his</u> seed is blessèd.

27 Flee from evil, and do the thing <u>that is</u> good; * <u>and dwell</u> for evermore.

28 For the LORD loveth the thing <u>that is</u> right; * he forsaketh not his that be godly,

but they are <u>preserved</u> for ever.



29 The unrighteous <u>shall be</u> punished; * as for the seed of the ungodly, <u>it shall</u> be rooted out.

30 The righteous shall in<u>herit the</u> land, ***** and dwell <u>therein</u> for ever.

31 The mouth of the righteous is exer<u>cised in</u> wisdom, ***** and his tongue will <u>be talking</u> of judgment.

32 The law of his God is <u>in his</u> heart, * and <u>his go</u>ings shall not slide.

33 The ungodly <u>watcheth the</u> righteous, * and seeketh <u>occasion</u> to slay him.

34 The LORD will not leave him <u>in his</u> hand, * nor <u>condemn him</u> when he is judged.



35 Hope *thou* in the LORD, and keep his way,

and he shall promote thee, that thou shalt possess <u>the</u> land: * when the ungodly shall per<u>ish, thou</u> shalt see it.

36 I myself have seen the ungodly in <u>great</u> power, * and flourishing like a green bay-tree.

37 I went by, and lo, he <u>was</u> gone: * I sought him, but his place <u>could no</u>where be found.

38 Keep innocency, and take heed unto the thing that <u>is</u> right; * for that shall bring a <u>man peace</u> at the last.

39 As for the transgressors, they shall perish <u>tog</u>ether; * and the end of the ungodly is, they shall be root<u>ed out</u> at the last.



40 But the salvation of the righteous cometh of <u>the</u> LORD; * who is also their strength in <u>the time</u> of trouble.

41 And the LORD shall stand by them, <u>and</u> save them: * he shall deliver them from the ungodly, and shall save them, because they put their trust in him.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Ho<u>ly</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

Psalm 38



Put *me* not to rebuke, O LORD, <u>in thine</u> anger; * neither chasten me in <u>thy heavy</u> displeasure:

2 For thine <u>arrows stick</u> fast in me, * and thy <u>hand press</u>eth me sore.

3 There is no health in my flesh, because of <u>thy displeasure</u>; * neither is there any rest in my bones, <u>by reason</u> of my sin.

4 For my wickednesses are gone <u>over my</u> head, * and are like a sore burden, <u>too heavy</u> for me to bear.

5 My wounds stink, and <u>are cor</u>rupt, * <u>through my</u> foolishness.

6 I am brought into so great <u>trouble and</u> misery, * that I go mourn<u>ing all</u> the day long.



7 For my loins are filled with a <u>sore dis</u>ease, ***** and there is no <u>whole part in</u> my body.

8 I am feeble <u>and sore</u> smitten; * I have roared for the very <u>disquiet</u>ness of my heart.

9 Lord, thou knowest <u>all my de</u>sire; ***** and my groan<u>ing is</u> not hid from thee.

10 My heart panteth, my <u>strength hath</u> failed me, * and the light of <u>mine eyes</u> is gone from me.

11 My lovers and my neighbours did stand looking up<u>on my</u> trouble,* and my kins<u>men stood</u> afar off.

12 They also that sought after my <u>life laid</u> snares for me; * and they that went about to do me evil talked of wickedness, and imagined <u>deceit all</u> the day long.

13 As for me, I was like a deaf <u>man, and</u> heard not; * and as one that is dumb, who doth <u>not op</u>en his mouth.

14 I became even as a man that <u>heareth</u> not, * and in <u>whose mouth</u> are no reproofs.

15 For in thee, O LORD, have I <u>put my</u> trust; * thou shalt answer <u>for me</u>, O Lord my God.

16 I have required that they, even mine enemies, should not <u>triumph</u> over me; * for when my foot slipt, they rejoiced greatly against me.

17 And I truly am set <u>in the</u> plague, ***** and my heaviness <u>is ev</u>er in my sight.



18 For I will confess my wickedness, * and be sorry for my sin.

19 But mine enemies live, <u>and are</u> mighty; ***** and they that hate me wrongfully <u>are many</u> in number.

20 They also that reward evil for good <u>are against me;</u> * because I follow <u>the thing</u> that good is.

21 Forsake me not, O <u>LORD my</u> God; * <u>be not</u> thou far from me.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Holy</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world with</u>out end. Amen.




I said, I will take heed to my <u>ways</u>, * that I offend not <u>in</u> my tongue

9 Deliver me from all mine of<u>fen</u>ces; * and make me not a rebuke un<u>to</u> the foolish.

10 I became dumb, and opened not my <u>mouth;</u> * for it <u>was</u> thy doing.

11 Take thy plague a<u>way</u> from me: * I am even consumed by the means of thy <u>hea</u>vy hand.

12 When thou with rebukes dost chasten man for sin,

thou makest his beauty to consume away, like as it were a moth fretting a <u>gar</u>ment: * every man therefore <u>is</u> but vanity.

13 Hear my prayer, O LORD, and with thine ears consider my <u>calling</u>; * hold not thy <u>peace at</u> my tears;

14 For I am a stranger with thee, and a <u>soj</u>ourner, * as all my <u>fa</u>thers were.

15 O spare me a little, that I may recover my <u>strength</u>, * before I go hence, and be <u>no</u> more seen.



Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

Psalm 40

9 Burnt-offering and sacrifice for sin hast thou not req<u>uired</u>: * then said <u>I, Lo</u>, I come;

10 In the volume of the book it is written of me, that I should fulfill thy will, O my <u>God</u>: *I am content to do it; yea, thy <u>law is within my heart</u>.

11 I have declared thy righteousness in the great congregation: * lo, I will not refrain my lips, O LORD, and <u>that thou</u> knowest.

12 I have not hid thy righteousness within my <u>heart</u>; * my talk hath been of thy truth, and of <u>thy sal</u>vation.

13 I have not kept back thy loving mercy and <u>truth</u> * from the <u>great congreg</u>ation.

14 Withdraw not thou thy mercy from me, O <u>LORD</u>; * let thy loving-kindness and thy truth <u>alway pre</u>serve me.

15 For innumerable troubles are come about me;

my sins have taken such hold upon me, that I am not able to look up; *

yea, they are more in number than the hairs of my head, and my <u>heart hath</u> failed me.

16 O LORD, let it be thy pleasure to de<u>li</u>ver me; * make haste, O <u>LORD, to</u> help me.



17 Let them be ashamed, and confounded together, that seek after my soul to destroy it; *

let them be driven backward, and put to rebuke, that wish me evil.

18 Let them be desolate, and rewarded with <u>shame</u>, * that say unto me, Fie upon thee! <u>fie up</u>on thee!

19 Let all those that seek thee, be joyful and <u>glad</u> in thee; * and let such as love thy salvation, say <u>alway</u>, <u>The</u> LORD be praised.

20 As for me, I am poor and <u>nee</u>dy; * but the Lord <u>careth</u> for me.

21 Thou art my helper and re<u>deem</u>er; * make no long <u>tarrying</u>, O my God.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world without</u> end. Amen.

10 But be thou merciful unto me, O <u>LORD;</u> * raise thou me up again, and <u>I shall</u> reward them.

11 By this I know thou <u>fa</u>vourest me, * that mine enemy doth not <u>triumph</u> against me.

12 And in my innocency thou up<u>hold</u>est me, ***** and shalt set me before thy <u>face</u> for ever.

[13 Blessèd be the LORD God of <u>Is</u>rael, * <u>world with</u>out end. Amen.]

and make my prayer unto the <u>God</u> of my life.

11 I will say unto the God of my strength, Why hast thou for<u>got</u>ten me? *why go I thus heavily, while the <u>enemy</u> oppresseth me?

12 My bones are smitten as under as with a <u>sword</u>, * while mine enemies that trouble me <u>cast</u> me in the teeth;

13 Namely, while they say daily <u>un</u>to me, * <u>Where</u> is now thy God?

14 Why art thou so vexed, O my <u>soul</u>? * and why art thou so dis<u>quieted</u> within me?

15 O put thy trust in God; *
for I will yet thank him,
 which is the help of my countenance, and my God.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without and <u>Amon</u>

world without end. Amen.





Give sentence with me, O God,

15 Thou makest us to be a by-word among the <u>na</u>tions, * and that the peoples <u>shake</u> their heads at us.

16 My confusion is daily be<u>fore</u> me, * and the shame of my <u>face</u> hath covered me;

17 For the voice of the slanderer and <u>blasphemer</u>, ***** for the enemy <u>and</u> avenger.

18 And though all this be come upon us, yet do we not forget thee, * nor behave ourselves frowardly <u>in</u> thy covenant.

19 Our heart is not turned <u>back</u>, * neither our steps gone <u>out of</u> thy way;


20 No, not when thou hast smitten us into the place of $\underline{\text{drag}}$ ons, * and covered us with the <u>shadow</u> of death.

11 So shall the King have pleasure in thy <u>beau</u>ty; * for he is thy Lord, and <u>worship</u> thou him.

16 Instead of thy fathers, thou shalt have <u>child</u>ren, * whom thou mayest make <u>princes in</u> all lands.

17 I will make thy Name to be remembered from one generation to a<u>no</u>ther; *

therefore shall the people give thanks unto thee, world without end.

11 And yet they think that their houses shall continue for ever,

and that their dwelling-places shall endure from one generation to another; *

and call the lands after their own names.

12 Nevertheless, man being in honour abideth <u>not</u>, * seeing he may be compared unto the <u>beasts</u> that perish;

13 This their way is very <u>fool</u>ishness; * yet their posterity <u>praise</u> their saying.


14 They lie in the grave like sheep; death is their shepherd; and the righteous shall have dominion over them in the <u>morning</u>: * their beauty shall consume in the sepulchre, and have <u>no</u> abiding.

15 But God hath delivered my soul from the power of the <u>grave</u>; * for <u>he shall</u> receive me.

16 Be not thou afraid, though one be made <u>rich</u>, * or if the glory of his <u>house be</u> increased;

17 For he shall carry nothing away with him when he <u>di</u>eth, * neither shall his pomp <u>fol</u>low him.

18 For while he lived, he counted himself an happy <u>man</u>; * and so long as thou doest well unto thyself, men <u>will</u> speak good of thee.



19 He shall follow the generation of his <u>fa</u>thers, * and shall <u>never</u> see light.

20 Man that is in honour but hath no under<u>stand</u>ing ***** is compared unto the <u>beasts</u> that perish.

10 For all the beasts of the <u>forest are</u> mine, * and so are the cattle <u>upon</u> a thousand hills.

11 I know all the fowls up<u>on the</u> mountains, * and the wild beasts of <u>the field</u> are in my sight.

12 If I be hungry, I <u>will not</u> tell thee; * for the whole world is mine, <u>and all</u> that is therein.

13 Thinkest thou that I will <u>eat bulls</u>' flesh, * <u>and drink</u> the blood of goats?

14 Offer unto <u>God thanksgiving</u>, * and pay thy vows <u>unto the</u> Most Highest.

15 And call upon me in the <u>time of</u> trouble; * so will I hear thee, <u>and thou</u> shalt praise me.

16 But unto the ung<u>odly saith</u> God, * Why dost thou preach my laws, and takest <u>my cove</u>nant in thy mouth;

17 Whereas thou hatest to <u>be reformed</u>, ***** and hast cast <u>my words</u> behind thee?



18 When thou sawest a thief, thou con<u>sentedst</u> unto him; * and hast been partak<u>er with the</u> adulterers.

19 Thou hast let thy <u>mouth speak</u> wickedness, * and with thy tongue <u>thou hast</u> set forth deceit.

20 Thou sattest and spakest against thy brother; * yea, and hast slandered thine own mother's son.

21 These things hast thou done, and I held my tongue,

and thou thoughtest wickedly, that I am even such a one <u>as thy</u>self; * but I will reprove thee, and set before thee <u>the things</u> that thou hast done.

22 O consider this, <u>ye that forg</u>et God, * lest I pluck you away, and there <u>be none to</u> deliver you.

23 Whoso offereth me thanks and <u>praise, he</u> honoureth me; * and to him that ordereth his way aright, will I show the <u>salva</u>tion of God.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Holy</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world with</u>out end. Amen.



Have *mercy* upon me, O God, after <u>thy great</u> goodness; * according to the multitude of thy mercies do <u>away mine</u> offences.

8 Thou shalt make me hear of joy and gladness, * that the bones which thou <u>hast broken</u> may rejoice.

9 Turn thy face <u>from my</u> sins, * and put <u>out all</u> my misdeeds.

10 Make me a clean <u>heart, O</u> God, * and renew a <u>right spirit</u> within me.

11 Cast me not away <u>from thy</u> presence, * and take not thy ho<u>ly Spi</u>rit from me.



12 O give me the comfort of thy <u>help again</u>, ***** and stablish me <u>with thy</u> free Spirit.

13 Then shall I teach thy ways un<u>to the</u> wicked, * and sinners shall be <u>convert</u>ed unto thee.

14 Deliver me from blood-guiltiness, O God, thou that art the God <u>of my</u> health; * and my tongue <u>shall sing of</u> thy righteousness.

15 Thou shalt open my <u>lips, O</u> Lord, * and <u>my mouth</u> shall show thy praise.

16 For thou desirest no sacrifice, else <u>would I</u> give it thee; * but thou delightest <u>not in</u> burnt-offerings.

17 The sacrifice of God is a <u>troubled</u> spirit: * a broken and contrite heart, <u>O God</u>, <u>shalt</u> thou not despise.

18 O be favourable and gracious <u>unto</u> Sion; * build thou <u>the walls of</u> Jerusalem.

19 Then shalt thou be pleased with the sacrifice of righteousness, with the burnt-offerings <u>and ob</u>lations; *then shall they offer young bullocks <u>upon</u> thine altar.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Holy</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world with</u>out end. Amen.

8 Lo, this is the man that took not God for his <u>strength;</u> * but trusted unto the multitude of his riches,

10 I will alway give thanks unto thee for that thou hast <u>done</u>; * and I will hope in thy Name, for thy <u>saints like</u> it well.

19 It is he that hath delivered my soul in peace from the battle that was <u>against me</u>; * for there <u>were many</u> that strove with me.

20 Yea, even God, that endureth for ever, shall hear me, and bring <u>them</u> down; * for they will <u>not turn</u>, nor fear God.

21 He laid his hands upon such as be <u>at peace</u> with him, ***** and <u>he brake</u> his covenant.



22 The words of his mouth were softer than butter, having war in <u>his</u> heart; *

his words were smoother than oil, and yet be they very swords.

23 O cast thy burden upon the LORD, and he <u>shall</u> nourish thee, * and shall not suffer the righteous <u>to fall</u> for ever.

24 And as <u>for</u> them, * thou, O God, shalt bring them into <u>the pit of</u> destruction.

25 The blood-thirsty and deceitful men shall not live out half <u>their</u> days: * nevertheless, my trust <u>shall be</u> in thee, O Lord.

9 Whensoever I call upon thee, then shall mine enemies be put to <u>flight</u>: *

this I know; for <u>God is</u> on my side.

10 In God's word will I rejoice; * in the LORD's word will I comfort me.

11 Yea, in God have I put my <u>trust;</u> * I will not be afraid what <u>man can</u> do unto me.

12 Unto thee, O God, will I pay my <u>vows</u>; * unto thee <u>will I</u> give thanks.

13 For thou hast delivered my soul from death, and my feet from <u>falling</u>, *

that I may walk before God in the light of the living.

8 But thou, O LORD, shalt have them in de<u>rision</u>, ***** and thou shalt laugh all the <u>heathen</u> to scorn.


9 My strength will I ascribe unto <u>thee</u>; * for thou art the <u>God of</u> my refuge.

3 Thus have I looked for thee <u>in the</u> sanctuary, ***** that I might behold <u>thy power</u> and glory.

4 For thy loving-kindness is better than <u>life it</u>self: * <u>my lips</u> shall praise thee.

5 As long as I live will I magnify thee <u>in this</u> manner, ***** and lift up <u>my hands</u> in thy Name.

6 My soul shall be satisfied, even as it were with <u>marrow and</u> fatness, * when my mouth prais<u>eth thee</u> with joyful lips.



7 Have I not remembered thee <u>in my</u> bed, * and thought upon thee <u>when I</u> was waking?

8 Because thou hast <u>been my</u> helper; * therefore under the shadow of <u>thy wings</u> will I rejoice.

9 My soul <u>hangeth up</u>on thee; * thy <u>right hand hath</u> upholden me.

10 These also that seek the <u>hurt of my</u> soul, * <u>they shall</u> go under the earth.

11 Let them fall upon the <u>edge of the</u> sword, * that they may be <u>a portion</u> for foxes.

12 But the King shall rejoice in God;

all they also that swear by him shall <u>be com</u>mended; * for the mouth of them <u>that speak</u> lies shall be stopped.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Holy</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world with</u>out end. Amen.



Hear my voice, O God, in my <u>prayer</u>; * preserve my life from <u>fear of the</u> enemy.

2 Hide me from the gathering together of the <u>fro</u>ward, * and from the insurrection of <u>wicked</u> doers;



3 Who have whet their tongue like a <u>sword</u>, * and shoot out their arrows, <u>even</u> bitter words;

4 That they may privily shoot at him that is <u>per</u>fect: * suddenly do they <u>hit him, and</u> fear not.

5 They encourage themselves in <u>mischief</u>, * and commune among themselves, how they may lay snares; and say, that no <u>man shall</u> see them.

6 They imagine wickedness, and <u>practice</u> it; * that they keep secret among themselves, every man in the <u>deep of</u> his heart.

7 But God shall suddenly shoot at them with a swift <u>ar</u>row, * that <u>they shall be</u> wounded.

8 Yea, their own tongues shall make them <u>fall</u>; * insomuch that whoso seeth them shall <u>laugh them</u> to scorn.

9 And all men that see it shall say, This hath God <u>done</u>; * for they shall perceive that <u>it is</u> his work.

10 The righteous shall rejoice in the LORD, and put his <u>trust</u> in him; * and all they that are true of <u>heart shall</u> be glad.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world without</u> end. Amen.

Psalm 65



Thou, O God, art praised in <u>Sion</u>; * and unto thee shall the vow be performed <u>in</u> Jerusalem.

2 Thou that hearest the <u>prayer</u>, * unto thee shall <u>all</u> flesh come.

3 My misdeeds prevail ag<u>ainst</u> me: * O be thou merciful <u>unto</u> our sins.

4 Blèssed is the man whom thou choosest, and receivest <u>un</u>to thee: * he shall dwell in thy court, and shall be satisfied with the pleasures of thy house,

even of thy holy temple.

5 Thou shalt show us wonderful things in thy righteousness, O God of our salvation; *

thou that art the hope of all the ends of the earth,

and of them that remain in the broad sea.

6 Who in his strength setteth fast the <u>moun</u>tains, * and is girded ab<u>out</u> with power.

7 Who stilleth the raging of the <u>sea</u>, ***** and the noise of his waves, and the madness <u>of</u> the peoples.

8 They also that dwell in the uttermost parts of the earth shall be afraid at thy <u>tokens</u>, *

thou that makest the out-goings of the morning and <u>evening</u> to praise thee.

9 Thou visitest the earth, and <u>bless</u>est it; * thou makest it <u>ve</u>ry plenteous.



10 The river of God is full of <u>wa</u>ter: * thou preparest their corn, for so thou providest <u>for</u> the earth.

11 Thou waterest her furrows;

thou sendest rain into the little valleys there<u>of;</u> * thou makest it soft with the drops of rain,

and blessest the <u>in</u>crease of it.

12 Thou crownest the year with thy <u>good</u>ness; * and thy <u>clouds</u> drop fatness.

13 They shall drop upon the dwellings of the <u>wil</u>derness; ***** and the little hills shall rejoice on <u>every</u> side.

14 The folds shall be full of <u>sheep</u>; *the valleys also shall stand so thick with corn, that they shall <u>laugh</u> and sing.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

Psalm 66



O *be* joyful in God, all <u>ye</u> lands; * sing praises unto the honour of his Name; make <u>his praise to</u> be glorious.

2 Say unto God, O how wonderful art thou in <u>thy</u> works! * through the greatness of thy power shall thine enem<u>ies bow down</u> unto thee.



3 For all the world <u>shall</u> worship thee, * sing <u>of thee</u>, and praise thy Name.

4 O come hither, and behold the works <u>of</u> God; * how wonderful he is in his doing toward <u>the child</u>ren of men.

5 He turned the sea in<u>to</u> dry land, * so that they went through the water on foot; there <u>did we</u> rejoice thereof.

6 He ruleth with his power for ever; his eyes behold <u>the</u> nations: * and such as will not believe shall not be able to exalt themselves.

7 O praise our God, <u>ye</u> peoples, * and make the voice of <u>his praise</u> to be heard;

8 Who holdeth our soul <u>in</u> life; * and suffer<u>eth not</u> our feet to slip.

9 For thou, O God, <u>hast</u> proved us; * thou also hast tried us, like <u>as sil</u>ver is tried.

10 Thou broughtest us into <u>the</u> snare; * and laid<u>est trouble</u> upon our loins.

11 Thou sufferedst men to ride over <u>our</u> heads; * we went through fire and water, and thou broughtest us out <u>into</u> a wealthy place.

12 I will go into thine house with burnt-offerings, and will pay thee \underline{my} vows, *

which I promised with my lips, and spake with my mouth, when \underline{I} was in trouble.



13 I will offer unto thee fat burnt-sacrifices, with the incense \underline{of} rams; *

I will offer bullocks and goats.

14 O come hither, and hearken, all ye that <u>fear</u> God; * and I will tell you what he <u>hath done</u> for my soul.

15 I called unto him with <u>my</u> mouth, * and gave <u>him praises</u> with my tongue.

16 If I incline unto wickedness with <u>mine</u> heart, * <u>the Lord will</u> not hear me.

17 But God <u>hath</u> heard me; * and considered <u>the voice</u> of my prayer.

18 Praised be God, who hath not cast out <u>my</u> prayer, * nor turned <u>his</u> mercy from me.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.



God be merciful unto us, and <u>bless</u> us, * and show us the light of his countenance, and be <u>merci</u>ful unto us;

2 That thy way may be known upon <u>earth</u>, * thy saving health am<u>ong</u> all nations.



3 Let the peoples praise thee, O <u>God</u>; * yea, let all the <u>peop</u>les praise thee.

4 O let the nations rejoice and be <u>glad</u>; * for thou shalt judge the folk righteously, and govern the <u>nations</u> upon earth.

5 Let the peoples praise thee, O <u>God</u>; * yea, let all the <u>peop</u>les praise thee.

6 Then shall the earth bring forth her <u>in</u>crease; ***** and God, even our own God, shall <u>give us</u> his blessing.

7 God shall <u>bless</u> us; * and all the ends of the <u>world</u> shall fear him.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world <u>with</u>out end. Amen.



Let God arise, and let his <u>enemies be</u> scattered; * let them also that hate him <u>flee be</u>fore him.

2 Like as the smoke vanisheth, so shalt thou <u>drive them</u> away; * and like as wax melteth at the fire,

so let the ungodly perish at the <u>pre</u>sence of God.

3 But let the righteous be glad, and rejoice before God; * let them also be <u>merry and</u> joyful.



4 O sing unto God, and sing praises unto his Name; magnify him that rideth up<u>on the</u> heavens; * praise him in his Name JAH, and rejoice before him.

5 He is a Father of the fatherless, and defendeth the <u>cause of the</u> widows; *

even God in his holy habitation.

6 He is the God that maketh men to be of one mind in an house, and bringeth the prisoners <u>out of captivity;</u> *
but letteth the runagates con<u>tinue in</u> scarceness.

7 O God, when thou wentest forth be<u>fore the</u> people; * when thou wentest <u>through the</u> wilderness,

8 The earth shook, and the heavens dropped at the presence of God;

* even as Sinai also was moved at the presence of God, who is the <u>God of</u> Israel.

9 Thou, O God, sentest a gracious rain up<u>on thine in</u>heritance, * and refreshedst it <u>when it was</u> weary.

10 Thy congregation shall dwell therein; * for thou, O God, hast of thy goodness pre<u>pared for</u> the poor.

11 The <u>Lord gave</u> the word; ***** great was the company of women that <u>bare the</u> tidings.

12 Kings with their armies did flee, and <u>were dis</u>comfited, ***** and they of the household divided the spoil.

13 Though ye have lain among the sheep-folds, yet shall ye be as the <u>wings of</u> a dove * that is covered with silver wings, and her <u>feathers</u> like gold.



14 When the Almighty scattered <u>kings for</u> their sake, * then were they as white as <u>snow</u> in Salmon.

15 As the hill of Bashan, <u>so is</u> God's hill; * even an high hill, as the <u>hill of</u> Bashan.

16 Why mock ye so, ye high hills?

this is God's hill, in the which it <u>pleaseth</u> him to dwell; * yea, the LORD will abide in <u>it for</u> ever.

17 The chariots of God are twenty thousand, even <u>thousands of</u> angels; *

and the Lord is among them as in the holy place of Sinai.

18 Thou art gone up on high,

thou hast led captivity captive, and re<u>ceived gifts</u> from men; * yea, even from thine enemies,

that the LORD God might <u>dwell among</u> them.



19 Praised be the Lord daily, *

even the God who helpeth us, and poureth his benefits upon us.

20 He is our God, even the God of whom cometh sal<u>va</u>tion: * GOD is the Lord, by <u>whom we</u> escape death.

21 God shall wound the head of his <u>en</u>emies, ***** and the hairy scalp of such a one as goeth on still <u>in</u> his wickedness.

22 The Lord hath said, I will bring my people again, as I did from <u>Ba</u>shan; *

mine own will I bring again,

as I did sometime from the <u>deep</u> of the sea.



23 That thy foot may be dipped in the blood of thine <u>en</u>emies, * and that the tongue of thy dogs may be <u>red</u> through the same.

24 It is well seen, O God, how thou <u>go</u>est; * how thou, my God and King, goest <u>in</u> the sanctuary.

25 The singers go before, the minstrels follow <u>after</u>, * in the midst of the damsels playing <u>with</u> the timbrels.

26 Give thanks unto God the Lord in the congregation, ***** ye that are of the <u>fountain</u> of Israel.

27 There is little Benjamin their ruler, and the princes of Judah their <u>coun</u>cil; * the princes of Zebulon, and the <u>princes</u> of Naphthali.

28 Thy God hath sent forth <u>strength</u> for thee; * stablish the thing, O God, that <u>thou</u> hast wrought in us,

29 For thy temple's sake at Je<u>ru</u>salem; * so shall kings bring <u>pre</u>sents unto thee.

30 Rebuke thou the dragon and the bull, with the leaders of the heathen,

so that they humbly bring pieces of <u>sil</u>ver; * scatter thou the peoples <u>that</u> delight in war;

31 Then shall the princes come out of <u>Egypt</u>; * the Morians' land shall soon stretch out her <u>hands</u> unto God.

32 Sing unto God, O ye kingdoms of the <u>earth;</u> * O sing praises <u>un</u>to the Lord;

33 Who sitteth in the heavens over all, from the beg<u>in</u>ning: ***** lo, he doth send out his voice; yea, and <u>that</u> a mighty voice.



34 Ascribe ye the power to God over <u>Is</u>rael; * his worship and <u>strength</u> is in the clouds.

35 O God, wonderful art thou in thy holy <u>pla</u>ces: * even the God of Israel, he will give strength and power unto his people.

<u>Bless</u>èd be God.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be,

world without end. Amen.



Save me, O <u>God;</u> * for the waters are come in, even <u>unto</u> my soul.

2 I stick fast in the deep mire, where no <u>ground</u> is; * I am come into deep waters, so that the <u>floods</u> run over me.


3 I am weary of crying; my throat is <u>dry;</u> * my sight faileth me for waiting so long up<u>on</u> my God.

4 They that hate me without a cause are more than the hairs of my <u>head;</u> *

5 I paid them the things that I never <u>took</u>: * God, thou knowest my simpleness,

and my faults are not <u>hid</u> from thee.



6 Let not them that trust in thee, O Lord GOD of hosts, be ashamed for my <u>cause;</u> *

let not those that seek thee be confounded through me,

O Lord <u>God</u> of Israel.

7 And why? for thy sake have I suffered re<u>proof;</u> * shame hath <u>covered</u> my face.

8 I am become a stranger unto my <u>bre</u>thren, * even an alien unto my <u>mo</u>ther's children.

9 For the zeal of thine house hath even <u>ea</u>ten me; * and the rebukes of them that rebuked thee are <u>fallen</u> upon me.

10 I wept, and chastened myself with <u>fasting</u>, * and that was turned to <u>my</u> reproof.

11 I put on sackcloth <u>also</u>, * and they <u>jested</u> upon me.


12 They that sit in the gate speak against me, * and the drunkards make <u>songs</u> upon me.

13 But, LORD, I make my prayer unto <u>thee</u> * in an ac<u>cepta</u>ble time.

14 Hear me, O God, in the multitude of thy <u>mer</u>cy, ***** even in the truth of <u>thy</u> salvation.

15 Take me out of the mire, that I sink <u>not</u>; * O let me be delivered from them that hate me, and <u>out of the</u> deep waters.

16 Let not the water-flood drown me, neither let the deep swallow me <u>up</u>; * and let not the pit shut her <u>mouth</u> upon me.



17 Hear me, O LORD, for thy loving-kindness is <u>com</u>fortable; * turn thee unto me according to the multitude <u>of</u> thy mercies.

18 And hide not thy face from thy servant; for I am in <u>trou</u>ble: * O <u>haste thee</u>, and hear me.

19 Draw nigh unto my soul, and <u>save</u> it; * O deliver me, be<u>cause of</u> mine enemies.

20 Thou hast known my reproach, my shame, and my dishonour: * mine adversaries are all <u>in</u> thy sight.

21 Reproach hath broken my heart; I am full of heaviness: *

I looked for some to have pity on me, but there was no man, neither found I <u>any</u> to comfort me.

22 They gave me gall to <u>eat</u>; * and when I was thirsty they gave me <u>vinegar</u> to drink.

23 Let their table be made a snare to take themselves with<u>al</u>; * and let the things that should have been for their wealth be unto them an oc<u>casion</u> of falling.

24 Let their eyes be blinded, that they see <u>not;</u> * and ever bow thou <u>down</u> their backs.

25 Pour out thine indignation up<u>on</u> them, ***** and let thy wrathful dis<u>pleasure</u> take hold of them.

26 Let their habitation be <u>void</u>, ***** and no man to <u>dwell in</u> their tents.

27 For they persecute him whom thou hast <u>smitten</u>; ***** and they talk how they may vex them whom <u>thou</u> hast wounded.



28 Let them fall from one wickedness to another, * and not come into thy righteousness.

29 Let them be wiped out of the book of the <u>living</u>, * and not be written am<u>ong</u> the righteous.

30 As for me, when I am poor and in <u>hea</u>viness, * thy help, O God, shall <u>lift</u> me up.

31 I will praise the Name of God with a <u>song</u>, * and magnify it <u>with</u> thanksgiving.

32 This also shall please the $\underline{\text{LORD}}$ * better than a bullock that hath <u>horns</u> and hoofs.

33 The humble shall consider this, and be <u>glad</u>: * seek ye after God, and your <u>soul</u> shall live.

34 For the LORD heareth the <u>poor</u>, * and despiseth <u>not</u> his prisoners.

35 Let heaven and earth <u>praise</u> him: * the sea, and all that <u>moveth</u> therein.

36 For God will save Sion, and build the cities of Judah, * that men may dwell there, and have it <u>in</u> possession.

37 The posterity also of his servants shall in<u>he</u>rit it; * and they that love his Name shall <u>dwell</u> therein.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without <u>end</u>. Amen.

Psalm 70



Haste *thee*, O God, to <u>de</u>liver me; * make haste <u>to help</u> me, O LORD.

2 Let them be ashamed and confounded that seek after <u>my</u> soul; * let them be turned backward and put to confusion <u>that wish</u> me evil.

3 Let them for their reward be soon brought <u>to</u> shame, * <u>that cry over</u> me, There! there!

6 Thou art my helper, and my <u>re</u>deemer: * O LORD, <u>make no</u> long tarrying.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Ho<u>ly</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world with</u>out end. Amen.





In *thee*, O LORD, have I put my trust; let me never be <u>put to conf</u>usion, * but rid me and deliver me in thy righteousness; incline thine ear un<u>to me</u>, and save me.



2 Be thou my stronghold, whereunto I may <u>alway re</u>sort: * thou hast promised to help me,

for thou art my house of <u>defence</u>, and my castle.

3 Deliver me, O my God, out of the hand of <u>the ung</u>odly, * out of the hand of the <u>unrighteous</u> and cruel man.

4 For thou, O Lord GOD, art the <u>thing that I</u> long for: * thou art <u>my hope, ev</u>en from my youth.

5 Through thee have I been holden up ever since <u>I was</u> born: * thou art he that took me out of my mother's womb:

my praise shall <u>be al</u>way of thee.

6 I am become as it were a monster <u>unto</u> many, * but my <u>sure trust</u> is in thee.

7 O let my mouth be <u>filled with thy</u> praise, * that I may sing of thy glory and hon<u>our all</u> the day long.

8 Cast me not away in the <u>time of</u> age; * forsake me not <u>when my</u> strength faileth me.

9 For mine enemies <u>speak against me</u>; * and they that lay wait for my soul take their counsel <u>toge</u>ther, saying,

10 God <u>hath for</u>saken him; * persecute him, and take him, for there <u>is none to</u> deliver him.

11 Go not far from <u>me, O</u> God; * my <u>God</u>, haste thee to help me.

12 Let them be confounded and perish that are against my soul; * let them be covered with shame and dishonour that seek to do me evil.



13 As for me, I will patient<u>ly abide</u> alway, ***** and <u>will praise</u> thee more and more.

14 My mouth shall daily speak of thy righteousness <u>and sal</u>vation; * for <u>I know</u> no end thereof.

15 I will go forth in the <u>strength of the</u> Lord God, * and will make mention of <u>thy righteous</u>ness only.

16 Thou, O God, hast taught me from my youth up <u>until</u> now; * therefore will <u>I tell of</u> thy wondrous works.

17 Forsake me not, O God, in mine old age, when <u>I am gray</u>headed, * until I have showed thy strength unto this generation, and thy power to all <u>them that are</u> yet for to come.

18 Thy righteousness, O God, is <u>very</u> high, * and great things are they that thou hast done: O God, who <u>is like</u> unto thee!

19 O what great troubles and adversities hast thou showed me! and yet didst thou <u>turn and re</u>fresh me; * yea, and broughtest me from <u>the deep of</u> the earth again.

20 Thou hast brought me <u>to great</u> honour, * and comfort<u>ed me</u> on every side:

21 Therefore will I praise thee, and thy faithfulness, O God, playing upon an <u>instrument of</u> music: * unto thee will I sing upon the harp, O thou Holy One of Israel.

22 My lips will be glad when I <u>sing unto</u> thee; ***** and so will my soul <u>whom thou hast</u> delivered.



23 My tongue also shall talk of thy righteousness all the day long; * for they are confounded and brought unto shame that seek to do me evil.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be,

world without end. Amen.



Give the *King* thy judgments, O God, * and thy righteousness unto the King's son.

2 Then shall he judge thy people ac<u>cording</u> unto right, * and defend the poor.

3 The mountains also shall bring peace, * and the little hills righteousness <u>unto</u> the people.

4 He shall keep the simple folk by their right, * defend the children of the poor, and punish the wrong doer.

5 They shall fear thee, as long as the sun and <u>moon en</u>dureth, * from one generation <u>to</u> another.

6 He shall come down like the rain upon the mown grass, * even as the drops that water the earth.

7 In his time shall the righteous flourish; * yea, and abundance of peace, so long as the moon endureth.



8 His dominion shall be also from the one sea <u>to the</u> other, ***** and from the River <u>unto</u> the world's end.

9 They that dwell in the wilderness shall <u>kneel be</u>fore him; * his <u>enemies</u> shall lick the dust.

10 The kings of Tarshish and of the isles <u>shall give</u> presents; * the kings of Arabia and <u>Saba</u> shall bring gifts.

11 All kings shall <u>fall down be</u>fore him; * all nations shall <u>do</u> him service.

12 For he shall deliver the <u>poor when he</u> crieth; * the needy also, and him that <u>hath</u> no helper.

13 He shall be favourable to the <u>simple and</u> needy, ***** and shall preserve the <u>souls</u> of the poor.

14 He shall deliver their souls from <u>falsehood</u> and wrong; * and dear shall their <u>blood</u> be in his sight.

15 He shall live, and unto him shall be given of the <u>gold of A</u>rabia; * prayer shall be made ever unto him, and daily <u>shall</u> he be praised.

16 There shall be an heap of corn in the earth, high upon the hills; the fruit thereof shall <u>shake like</u> Lebanon: *and they of the city shall flourish like <u>grass</u> upon the earth.

17 His Name shall endure for ever;

his Name shall remain under the sun among the posterities, which shall be <u>blessèd</u> in him; * and all the nations shall praise him.

18 Blessèd be the LORD God, even the <u>God of</u> Israel, * which only doeth wondrous things;



19 And blessèd be the Name of his <u>majesty for</u> ever: * and all the earth shall be filled with his majesty. <u>A</u>men, Amen.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Holy</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world <u>with</u>out end. Amen.

BOOK III



Truly God is loving unto <u>Is</u>rael: * even unto such as are <u>of a</u> clean heart.

2 Nevertheless, my feet were almost <u>gone</u>, * my treadings <u>had well</u>-nigh slipt.

3 And why? I was grieved at the <u>wi</u>cked: * I do also see the ungodly in <u>such pro</u>sperity.

4 For they are in no peril of <u>death</u>; * but are <u>lusty</u> and strong.

5 They come in no misfortune like other <u>folk;</u> * neither are they <u>plagued like</u> other men.



6 And this is the cause that they are so holden with <u>pride</u>, ***** and cruelty covereth them <u>as a</u> garment.

7 Their eyes swell with <u>fat</u>ness, * and they do <u>even</u> what they lust.

8 They corrupt other, and speak of wicked <u>blasphemy</u>; * their talking is ag<u>ainst the</u> Most High.

9 For they stretch forth their mouth unto the <u>hea</u>ven, * and their tongue <u>goeth</u> through the world.

10 Therefore fall the people <u>un</u>to them, ***** and thereout suck they no <u>small advantage</u>.

11 Tush, say they, how should God per<u>ceive</u> it? * is there knowledge <u>in the</u> Most High?

12 Lo, these are the un<u>godly</u>, * these prosper in the world, and these have riches <u>in pos</u>session:

13 And I said, Then have I cleansed my heart in <u>vain</u>, * and washed my <u>hands in</u> innocency.

14 All the day long have I been <u>pun</u>ished, ***** and chastened <u>every</u> morning.

15 Yea, and I had almost said even as <u>they</u>; * but lo, then I should have condemned the generation <u>of thy</u> children.

16 Then thought I to under<u>stand</u> this; * but it <u>was too</u> hard for me,

17 Until I went into the sanctuary of <u>God</u>: * then understood I the <u>end of</u> these men;



18 Namely, how thou dost set them in slippery <u>places</u>, ***** and castest them down, <u>and de</u>stroyest them.

19 O how suddenly do they con<u>sume</u>, * perish, and <u>come to a</u> fearful end!

20 Yea, even like as a dream when one a<u>wa</u>keth; * so shalt thou make their image to vanish <u>out of the</u> city.

21 Thus my heart was <u>grieved</u>, * and it went <u>even</u> through my reins.

22 So foolish was I, and <u>ignorant</u>, * even as it were a <u>beast be</u>fore thee.

23 Nevertheless, I am alway <u>by</u> thee; * for thou hast holden me <u>by my</u> right hand.

24 Thou shalt guide me with thy <u>coun</u>sel, * and after that re<u>ceive me with glory</u>.

25 Whom have I in heaven but <u>thee</u>? * and there is none upon earth that I desire in com<u>parison</u> of thee.

26 My flesh and my heart <u>fail</u>eth; ***** but God is the strength of my heart, and my <u>portion for</u> ever.

27 For lo, they that forsake thee shall <u>per</u>ish; * thou hast destroyed all them that are un<u>faithful</u> unto thee.

28 But it is good for me to hold me fast by God, to put my trust in the Lord God, * and to speak of all thy works in the gates of the <u>daughter of</u> Sion.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world without</u> end. Amen.

Psalm 74



O *God*, wherefore art thou absent from us <u>so</u> long? * why is thy wrath so hot against <u>the sheep of</u> thy pasture?

2 O think upon thy congregation, * whom thou hast pur<u>chased, and</u> redeemed of old.

3 Think upon the tribe of thine <u>in</u>heritance, ***** and Mount Sion, <u>wherein</u> thou hast dwelt.

4 Lift up thy feet, that thou mayest utterly destroy every enemy, * which hath done evil in thy sanctuary.

5 Thine adversaries roar in the midst of thy congregations, * and set up <u>their banners</u> for tokens.

6 He that hewed timber afore out of the <u>thick</u> trees, * was known to bring it to <u>an ex</u>cellent work.

7 But now they break down all the carved work <u>there</u>of * <u>with axes</u> and hammers.

8 They have set fire upon thy ho<u>ly</u> places, * and have defiled the dwelling-place of thy Name, ev<u>en un</u>to the ground.

9 Yea, they said in their hearts, Let us make havoc of them al<u>tog</u>ether: * thus have they burnt up all the houses <u>of God</u> in the land.

10 We see not our tokens;

there is not one prophet more; *

no, not one is there among us, that und<u>erstand</u>eth any more.

11 O God, how long shall the adversary do this <u>dis</u>honour? * shall the enemy blaspheme <u>thy Name</u> for ever?



12 Why withdrawest thou <u>thy</u> hand? * why pluckest thou not thy right hand out of thy bosom to <u>consume</u> the enemy?

13 For God is my King <u>of</u> old; * the help that is done upon earth, <u>he do</u>eth it himself.

14 Thou didst divide the sea through <u>thy</u> power; * thou brakest the heads of the dragons in the waters.

15 Thou smotest the heads of leviathan <u>in</u> pieces, ***** and gavest him to be meat for the peo<u>ple of</u> the wilderness.

16 Thou broughtest out fountains and waters out of the <u>hard</u> rocks; * thou driedst <u>up migh</u>ty waters.

17 The day is thine, and the night <u>is</u> thine; * thou hast prepared <u>the light</u> and the sun.

18 Thou hast set all the borders of <u>the</u> earth; * thou hast <u>made summer</u> and winter.

19 Remember this, O LORD, how the enemy hath <u>re</u>buked; * and how the foolish people <u>hath blasphemed</u> thy Name.

20 O deliver not the soul of thy turtle-dove unto the multitude of <u>the</u> enemies; * and forget not the congregation of <u>the poor</u> for ever.

21 Look upon <u>the co</u>venant; ***** for all the earth is full of darkness <u>and cruel ha</u>bitations.

22 O let not the simple go away <u>a</u>shamed; * but let the poor and needy <u>give praise</u> unto thy Name.



23 Arise, O God, maintain thine <u>own</u> cause; * remember how the foolish <u>man blasphemeth</u> thee daily.

24 Forget not the voice of <u>thine</u> enemies: * the presumption of them that hate thee increas<u>eth ev</u>er more and more.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Ho<u>ly</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be,

world without end. Amen.



Unto thee, O God, do we give <u>thanks</u>; * yea, unto thee do <u>we</u> give thanks.

2 Thy Name also is so <u>nigh;</u> * and that do thy wondrous <u>works</u> declare.

3 In the appointed time, saith <u>God</u>, * I shall judge according <u>un</u>to right.

4 The earth is weak, and all the inhabiters there<u>of</u>: * I bear up the <u>pillars</u> of it.

5 I said unto the fools, Deal not so <u>madly</u>; * and to the ungodly, Set not <u>up</u> your horn.

6 Set not up your horn on <u>high</u>, * and speak not <u>with a</u> stiff neck.



7 For promotion cometh neither from the east, nor from the <u>west</u>, * nor yet <u>from</u> the south.

8 And why? God is the Judge; * he putteth down one, and setteth <u>up</u> another.

9 For in the hand of the LORD there is a cup, and the wine is <u>red</u>; * it is full mixt, and he poureth <u>out of</u> the same.

10 As for the <u>dregs</u> thereof, ***** all the ungodly of the earth shall drink them, and <u>suck</u> them out.

11 But I will talk of the God of Jacob, * and praise him for ever.

12 All the horns of the ungodly also will I <u>break</u>, * and the horns of the righteous shall <u>be</u> exalted.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.



In *Ju*dah <u>is God</u> known; * his Name <u>is great</u> in Israel.

2 At Salem <u>is his</u> tabernacle, * and <u>his dwelling</u> in Sion.



3 There brake he the arrows <u>of the</u> bow, * the shield, <u>the sword</u>, and the battle.

4 Thou art <u>glorious in</u> might, * when thou comest from <u>the hills of</u> the robbers.

5 The proud are robbed, they have <u>slept their</u> sleep; ***** and all the men whose hands were might<u>y have</u> found nothing.

6 At thy rebuke, O <u>God of</u> Jacob, * both the chariot <u>and horse</u> are fallen.

7 Thou, even thou art <u>to be</u> feared; * and who may stand in thy sight <u>when thou</u> art angry?

8 Thou didst cause thy judgment to be <u>heard from</u> heaven; * the <u>earth tremb</u>led, and was still,

9 When God ar<u>ose to</u> judgment, * and to help all <u>the meek</u> upon earth.

10 The fierceness of man shall <u>turn to thy</u> praise; * and the fierceness <u>of them</u> shalt thou refrain.

11 Promise unto the LORD your God, and keep it, all ye that are <u>round about him</u>; *bring presents unto him <u>that ought</u> to be feared.

12 He shall refrain the <u>spirit of princes</u>, * and is wonderful among <u>the kings</u> of the earth.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Holy</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world with</u>out end. Amen.

Psalm 77



I will cry unto <u>God with</u> my voice; * even unto God will I cry with my voice, and he shall <u>hearken</u> unto me.

2 In the time of my <u>trouble I</u> sought the Lord: * I stretched forth my hands unto him,

and ceased not in the night season; my soul refused comfort.

3 When I am in heaviness, I will <u>think up</u>on God; * when my heart is <u>vexed</u>, <u>I</u> will complain.

4 Thou <u>holdest mine</u> eyes waking: * I am so feeble that <u>I cannot</u> speak.

5 I have con<u>sidered the</u> days of old, ***** and the <u>years that</u> are past.

6 I call to re<u>membrance</u> my song, * and in the night I commune with mine own heart, and <u>search out my</u> spirit.

7 Will the Lord absént him<u>self for</u> ever? * and will he be no <u>more in</u>treated?

8 Is his mercy clean <u>gone for</u> ever? * and is his promise come utterly to an <u>end for</u> evermore?

9 Hath God forgotten <u>to be</u> gracious? ***** and will he shut up his loving-kindness <u>in dis</u>pleasure?

10 And I said, It is mine <u>own in</u>firmity; * but I will remember the years of the right hand <u>of the</u> Most Highest.

11 I will remember the <u>works of</u> the LORD, * and call to mind thy <u>wonders of</u> old time.



12 I will think <u>also of</u> all thy works, * and my talking shall be <u>of thy</u> doings.

13 Thy way, O <u>God, is</u> holy: * who is so great a <u>God as</u> our God?

14 Thou art the God that <u>doest</u> wonders, * and hast declared thy power am<u>ong the</u> peoples.

15 Thou hast mightily de<u>livered thy</u> people, * even the sons of <u>Jacob and</u> Joseph.

16 The waters saw thee, O God,

the waters <u>saw thee</u>, <u>and</u> were afraid; * the depths <u>also were</u> troubled.

17 The clouds poured out <u>water, the air</u> thundered, ***** and thine <u>arrows</u> went abroad.

18 The voice of thy thunder was <u>heard round</u> about: * the lightnings shone upon the ground;

the earth was \underline{moved} , and shook withal.

19 Thy way is in the sea, and thy paths <u>in the</u> great waters, * and thy <u>footsteps</u> are not known.

20 Thou leddest thy <u>people</u> like sheep, ***** by the hand of <u>Moses</u> and Aaron.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Holy</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world without</u> end. Amen.

Psalm 78



Hear my law, O my <u>peop</u>le; * incline your ears unto the <u>words</u> of my mouth.

2 I will open my mouth in a <u>pa</u>rable; * I will declare hard <u>sen</u>tences of old;

3 Which we have heard and <u>known</u>, * and such as our <u>fathers</u> have told us;

4 That we should not hide them from the children of the generations to <u>come</u>; *

but to show the honour of the LORD,

his mighty and wonderful works that he hath done.

5 He made a covenant with Jacob, and gave Israel a <u>law</u>, * which he commanded our forefathers to <u>teach</u> their children;

6 That their posterity might <u>know</u> it, * and the children <u>which</u> were yet unborn;

7 To the intent that when they came <u>up</u>, * they might show their <u>child</u>ren the same;

8 That they might put their trust in <u>God</u>; * and not to forget the works of God, but to <u>keep his</u> commandments;

9 And not to be as their forefathers, a faithless and stubborn gene<u>ra</u>tion; *

a generation that set not their heart aright,

and whose spirit clave not stedfastly unto God;

10 Like as the children of <u>Eph</u>raim; * who being harnessed, and carrying bows, turned themselves back in the <u>day</u> of battle.



11 They kept not the covenant of <u>God</u>, * and would not <u>walk</u> in his law;

12 But forgat what he had <u>done</u>, * and the wonderful works that <u>he</u> had showed for them.

13 Marvellous things did he in the sight of our forefathers, in the land of \underline{E} gypt, * even in the <u>field</u> of Zoan.

14 He divided the sea, and let them go <u>through</u>; * he made the waters to <u>stand</u> on an heap.

15 In the day-time also he led them with a <u>cloud</u>, * and all the night through <u>with</u> a light of fire.

16 He clave the hard rocks in the <u>wil</u>derness, ***** and gave them drink thereof, as it had been <u>out of</u> the great depth.

17 He brought waters out of the stony <u>rock</u>, * so that it gushed out <u>like</u> the rivers.

18 Yet for all this they sinned more against him, ***** and provoked the Most Highest <u>in</u> the wilderness.

19 They tempted God in their <u>hearts</u>, * and required <u>meat</u> for their lust.

20 They spake against God also, <u>say</u>ing, * Shall God prepare a table <u>in</u> the wilderness?

21 He smote the stony rock indeed,

that the water gushed out, and the streams <u>flowed</u> withal; * but can he give bread also, or provide <u>flesh for</u> his people?



22 When the LORD heard this, he was <u>wroth</u>; * so the fire was kindled in Jacob,

and there came up heavy displeasure against Israel;

23 Because they believed not in <u>God</u>, * and put not their <u>trust</u> in his help.

24 So he commanded the clouds ab<u>ove</u>, * and opened the <u>doors</u> of heaven.

25 He rained down manna also upon them for to \underline{eat} , * and gave them \underline{food} from heaven.

26 So man did eat angels' <u>food;</u> * for he <u>sent</u> them meat enough.

27 He caused the east-wind to blow under <u>hea</u>ven; * and through his power he <u>brought in</u> the southwest-wind.

28 He rained flesh upon them as thick as <u>dust</u>, * and feathered fowls like as the <u>sand</u> of the sea.

29 He let it fall among their <u>tents</u>, * even round about their <u>ha</u>bitation.

30 So they did eat, and were well filled; for he gave them their own de<u>sire</u>: * they were not disappointed of their lust.

31 But while the meat was yet in their mouths, the heavy wrath of God came upon them,

and slew the <u>wealth</u>iest of them; * yea, and smote down the chosen men that <u>were</u> in Israel.



32 But *for* all this they <u>sinned yet</u> more, ***** and <u>believed not</u> his wondrous works.

33 Therefore their days did he con<u>sume in</u> vanity, ***** and <u>their years</u> in trouble.

34 When he <u>slew them</u>, <u>they</u> sought him, * and turned them early, and <u>inquired</u> after God.

35 And they remembered that <u>God was their</u> strength, * and that the High God <u>was their</u> redeemer.

36 Nevertheless, they did but flatter him <u>with their</u> mouth, * and dissembled <u>with him</u> in their tongue.

37 For their heart <u>was not</u> whole with him, * neither continued they sted<u>fast in</u> his covenant.

38 But he was so merciful, that he forgave <u>their mis</u>deeds, * <u>and de</u>stroyed them not.

39 Yea, many a time turned <u>he his</u> wrath away, ***** and would not suffer his whole <u>displea</u>sure to arise.

40 For he considered that <u>they were but</u> flesh, * and that they were even a wind that passeth away, <u>and com</u>eth not again.

41 Many a time did they provoke him <u>in the</u> wilderness, * and grieved <u>him in</u> the desert.

42 They turned back, and <u>tempted</u> God, * and provoked the Ho<u>ly One</u> in Israel.

43 They thought not <u>of his</u> hand, ***** and of the day when he delivered them from <u>the hand of</u> the enemy;



44 How he had wrought his mira<u>cles in</u> Egypt, ***** and his wonders in <u>the field</u> of Zoan.

45 He turned their waters <u>into</u> blood, * so that they might <u>not drink of</u> the rivers.

46 He sent flies among them, and de<u>voured them</u> up; * <u>and frogs to</u> destroy them.

47 He gave their fruit un<u>to the</u> caterpillar, ***** and their lab<u>our unto</u> the grasshopper.

48 He destroyed their <u>vines with</u> hailstones, * and <u>their mulberry</u>-trees with the frost.

49 He smote their cattle <u>also with</u> hailstones, * and <u>their flocks with</u> hot thunderbolts.

50 He cast upon them the furiousness of his wrath, anger, dis<u>pleasure, and</u> trouble: * and sent ev<u>il angels</u> among them.

51 He made a way to his indignation, and spared not their soul from death; *

but gave their life over to the pestilence;

52 And smote all the <u>firstborn in</u> Egypt, * the most principal and mightiest in <u>the dwell</u>ings of Ham.

53 But as for his own people, he led them <u>forth like</u> sheep, * and carried them in <u>the wilder</u>ness like a flock.

54 He brought them out safely, that <u>they should not</u> fear, * and overwhelmed <u>their enemies</u> with the sea.



55 And brought them within the borders <u>of his</u> sanctuary, * even to this mountain, which he pur<u>chased with</u> his right hand.

56 He cast out the heathen <u>also be</u>fore them, * caused their land to be divided among them for an heritage, and made the tribes of Israel to dwell in their tents.



57 Yet they tempted and displeased the Most High <u>God</u>, * and <u>kept not</u> his testimonies.

58 They turned their backs, and fell away like their <u>fore</u>fathers; * starting aside <u>like</u> a broken bow.

59 For they grieved him with their hill-<u>al</u>tars, ***** and provoked him to displeasure <u>with</u> their images.

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60 When God heard this, he was <u>wroth</u>, * and took sore dis<u>pleasure</u> at Israel;
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61 So that he forsook the tabernacle in <u>Shi</u>loh, * even the tent that he had <u>pitched</u> among men.

62 He delivered their power into cap<u>ti</u>vity, ***** and their beauty into the <u>en</u>emy's hand.

63 He gave his people over also unto the <u>sword</u>, * and was wroth with <u>his</u> inheritance.

64 The fire consumed their young <u>men</u>, ***** and their maidens were not <u>given</u> in marriage.

65 Their priests were slain with the <u>sword</u>, ***** and there were no widows to <u>make la</u>mentation.



66 So the Lord awaked as one out of <u>sleep</u>, * and like a <u>giant</u> refreshed with wine.

67 He drave his enemies <u>back</u>ward, * and put them <u>to a</u> perpetual shame.

68 He refused the tabernacle of Joseph, * and chose not the <u>tribe</u> of Ephraim;

69 But chose the tribe of J<u>u</u>dah, * even the hill of <u>Si</u>on which he loved.

70 And there he built his temple on <u>high</u>, * and laid the foundation of it like the ground which he hath <u>made</u> continually.

71 He chose David also his <u>ser</u>vant, * and took him away <u>from</u> the sheep-folds:

72 As he was following the ewes with their young he <u>took</u> him, * that he might feed Jacob his people, and Israel <u>his</u> inheritance.

73 So he fed them with a faithful and true <u>heart</u>, * and ruled them prudently with <u>all</u> his power.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world with</u>out end. Amen.

Psalm 79



O God, the heathen are come into thine in<u>he</u>ritance; * thy holy temple have they defiled,

and made Jerusalem an heap of stones.

2 The dead bodies of thy servants have they given to be meat unto the fowls of the \underline{air} , *

and the flesh of thy saints unto the <u>beasts of</u> the land.

3 Their blood have they shed like water on every side of Je<u>ru</u>salem, * and there was no <u>man</u> to bury them.

4 We are become an open shame to our <u>en</u>emies, * a very scorn and derision unto them that are <u>round</u> about us.

5 LORD, how long wilt thou be <u>angry</u>? * shall thy jealousy burn like <u>fire</u> for ever?

6 Pour out thine indignation upon the heathen that have not <u>known</u> thee; *

and upon the kingdoms that have not called up<u>on</u> thy Name.

7 For they have devoured Jacob, * and laid <u>waste</u> his dwelling-place.

8 O remember not our old sins, but have mercy upon us, and that <u>soon</u>; * for we are <u>come to</u> great misery.

9 Help us, O God of our salvation, for the glory of thy <u>Name</u>: * O deliver us, and be merciful unto our sins, <u>for</u> thy Name's sake.

10 Wherefore do the heathen <u>say</u>, * Where is <u>now</u> their God?



11 O let the vengeance of thy servants' blood that is <u>shed</u>, ***** be openly showed upon the heathen, <u>in</u> our sight.

12 O let the sorrowful sighing of the prisoners come be<u>fore</u> thee; * according to the greatness of thy power,

preserve thou those that are appointed to die.

13 And for the blasphemy where with our neighbours have $\underline{blas}phemed$ thee, *

reward thou them, O Lord, sevenfold into their bosom.

14 So we, that are thy people, and sheep of thy pasture, shall give thee thanks for <u>ever</u>, * and will alway be showing forth thy praise from generation

and will alway be showing forth thy praise from generation to <u>ge</u>neration.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be,

world without end. Amen.

Psalm 80



Hear, O thou Shepherd of Israel,

thou that leadest Joseph like a flock; * show thyself also, thou that sittest up<u>on the</u> Cherubim.

2 Before Ephraim, Benjamin, <u>and Ma</u>nasseh, * stir up thy strength, and <u>come and</u> help us.

3 <u>Turn us ag</u>ain, O God; *

show the light of thy countenance, and we shall be whole.



4 O <u>LORD God</u> of hosts, * how long wilt thou be angry with thy <u>people that</u> prayeth?

5 Thou feedest them <u>with the</u> bread of tears, * and givest them <u>plenteousness of</u> tears to drink.

6 Thou hast made us a very strife un<u>to our</u> neighbours, ***** and our enemies <u>laugh us</u> to scorn.

7 Turn us ag<u>ain, thou</u> God of hosts; * show the light of thy countenance, and <u>we shall</u> be whole.

8 Thou hast brought a <u>vine out of</u> Egypt; * thou hast cast out the <u>heathen, and</u> planted it.

9 Thou <u>madest</u> room for it; * and when it had taken <u>root, it</u> filled the land.

10 The hills were covered with the <u>shadow</u> of it, * and the boughs thereof were like the <u>goodly</u> cedar-trees.

11 She stretched out her branches <u>unto</u> the sea, ***** and her boughs un<u>to the</u> River.

12 Why hast thou then <u>broken</u> down her hedge, * that all they that go by <u>pluck off</u> her grapes?

13 The wild boar out of the <u>wood doth</u> root it up, ***** and the wild beasts of the <u>field de</u>vour it.

14 Turn thee again, thou God of hosts, look <u>down from</u> heaven, * behold, and <u>visit</u> this vine;

15 And the place of the vineyard that thy right <u>hand hath</u> planted, ***** and the branch that thou madest so <u>strong for</u> thyself.



16 It is burnt with <u>fire, and</u> cut down; ***** and they shall perish at the re<u>buke of thy</u> countenance.

17 Let thy hand be upon the <u>man of thy</u> right hand, * and upon the son of man, whom thou madest so <u>strong for</u> thine own self.

18 And so will <u>not we go</u> back from thee: * O let us live, and we shall <u>call up</u>on thy Name.

19 Turn us again, O <u>LORD God</u> of hosts; * show the light of thy countenance, and <u>we shall</u> be whole.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Holy</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world without</u> end. Amen.

Psalm 81



Sing we merrily unto God our <u>strength</u>; * make a cheerful noise unto the <u>God</u> of Jacob.

2 Take the psalm, bring hither the <u>ta</u>bret, * the merry <u>harp</u> with the lute.

3 Blow up the trumpet in the new <u>moon</u>, * even in the time appointed, and upon our <u>sol</u>emn feast-day.

4 For this was made a statute for <u>Is</u>rael, * and a law of the <u>God</u> of Jacob.



5 This he ordained in Joseph for a <u>te</u>stimony, * when he came out of the land of Egypt, and had <u>heard a</u> strange language.

6 I eased his shoulder from the <u>bur</u>den, ***** and his hands were delivered from <u>making</u> the pots.

7 Thou calledst upon me in troubles, and I de<u>li</u>vered thee; ***** and heard thee what time as the storm <u>fell up</u>on thee.

8 I proved thee <u>also</u> * at the <u>wa</u>ters of strife.

9 Hear, O my people; and I will assure thee, O <u>Is</u>rael, * if thou wilt <u>heark</u>en unto me,

10 There shall no strange god be in <u>thee</u>, * neither shalt thou worship <u>any</u> other god.

11 I am the LORD thy God,

who brought thee out of the land of <u>Egypt</u>: * open thy mouth wide, and <u>I</u> shall fill it.

12 But my people would not hear my <u>voice</u>; * and Israel would <u>not</u> obey me;

13 So I gave them up unto their own hearts' <u>lusts</u>, * and let them follow their own imaginations.

14 O that my people would have hearkened <u>un</u>to me! * for if Israel had <u>walked</u> in my ways,

15 I should soon have put down their <u>en</u>emies, ***** and turned my hand against their adversaries.



16 The haters of the LORD should have submitted themselves un<u>to</u> him; *

but their time should have en<u>dured</u> for ever.

17 I would have fed them also with the finest wheat-<u>flour</u>; * and with honey out of the stony rock would I have <u>sa</u>tisfied thee.

world <u>with</u>out end. Amen.

8 Assyria <u>also is</u> joined with them; * they have holpen <u>the child</u>ren of Lot.

9 But do thou to them as <u>unto the</u> Midianites; * unto Sisera, and unto Jabin at <u>the brook</u> of Kishon;

10 Who <u>perished at</u> Endor, * and became as <u>the dung</u> of the earth.

11 Make them and their princes like <u>Oreb and</u> Zeeb; * yea, make all their princes like <u>as Zebah and</u> Zalmunna;

12 Who say, Let us <u>take to our</u>selves * the houses <u>of God in</u> possession.

13 O my God, make them like unto the <u>whirling</u> dust, ***** and as <u>the stubble</u> before the wind;

14 Like as the fire that burneth <u>up the</u> forest, * and as the flame that <u>consumeth</u> the mountains;

15 Pursue them even so <u>with thy</u> tempest, * and make them <u>afraid</u> with thy storm.

16 Make their faces a<u>shamed</u>, <u>O LORD</u>, * <u>that they</u> may seek thy Name.

17 Let them be confounded and vexed ever <u>more and</u> more; * let them be put <u>to shame</u>, and perish.

18 And they shall know that thou, whose <u>Name is JEHOVAH</u>, * art only the Most High<u>est ov</u>er all the earth.

8 O LORD God of hosts, hear my <u>prayer;</u> * hearken, O <u>God</u> of Jacob.

9 Behold, O God our de<u>fen</u>der, ***** and look upon the face of <u>thine</u> anointed.

10 For one day in thy <u>courts</u> * is better <u>than</u> a thousand.

11 I had rather be a door-keeper in the house of my <u>God</u>, * than to dwell in the <u>tents of</u> ungodliness.

12 For the LORD God is a light and de<u>fence;</u> * the LORD will give grace and worship;

and no good thing shall he withhold from them that live a <u>god</u>ly life.

13 O LORD God of <u>hosts</u>, * blessèd is the man that putteth his trust in thee.

10 Mercy and truth are met <u>tog</u>ether: * righteousness and peace <u>have kissed</u> each other.

11 Truth shall flourish out of <u>the</u> earth, * and righteousness hath <u>looked down</u> from heaven.

12 Yea, the LORD shall show loving-kindness; * and our land <u>shall give</u> her increase.

13 Righteousness shall go <u>be</u>fore him, * and shall direct <u>his going</u> in the way.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Ho<u>ly</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world with</u>out end. Amen.



Bow down thine ear, O LORD, and <u>hear</u> me; * for I am <u>poor, and</u> in misery.

10 For thou art great, and doest wondrous <u>things</u>: * thou art <u>God</u> alone.

11 Teach me thy way, O LORD, and I will walk in thy <u>truth</u>: * O knit my heart unto thee, that I may <u>fear</u> thy Name.



12 I will thank thee, O Lord my God, with all my <u>heart;</u> * and will praise thy Name for <u>ev</u>ermore.

13 For great is thy mercy <u>toward</u> me; * and thou hast delivered my soul from the <u>nether</u>most hell.

15 But thou, O Lord God, art full of compassion and <u>mer</u>cy, * long-suffering, plenteous in <u>goodness</u> and truth.

16 O turn thee then unto me, and have mercy up<u>on</u> me; * give thy strength unto thy servant, and help the <u>son of</u> thine handmaid.

17 Show some token upon me for good;

that they who hate me may see it, and be ash<u>amed</u>, * because thou, LORD, hast <u>holpen me</u>, and comforted me.

6 The LORD shall record it, when he writeth up the <u>peop</u>les; * lo, in <u>Si</u>on were they born.

7 The singers also and trumpeters shall make <u>an</u>swer: * All my fresh <u>springs</u> are in thee.

10 Dost thou show wonders among the dead? * or shall the dead rise up <u>again</u>, and praise thee?

11 Shall thy loving-kindness be <u>showed in the</u> grave? * or thy faithful<u>ness in</u> destruction?

12 Shall thy wondrous works be <u>known in the</u> dark? ***** and thy righteousness in the land where all <u>things are</u> forgotten?

13 Unto thee <u>have I cried</u>, O LORD; * and early shall <u>my prayer come</u> before thee.



14 LORD, why abhorrest <u>thou my</u> soul, * and hid<u>est thou</u> thy face from me?

15 I am in misery, and like unto him that is at the <u>point to</u> die; * even from my youth up,

thy terrors have I suffered with a troubled mind.

16 Thy wrathful displeasure <u>goeth</u> over me, ***** and the fear <u>of thee hath</u> undone me.

17 They came round about me <u>daily like</u> water, * and compassed me <u>together</u> on every side.

18 My lovers and friends hast thou <u>put a</u>way from me, ***** and hid mine acquain<u>tance out</u> of my sight.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the <u>Holy</u> Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be,

Psalm 89



My song shall be alway of the loving-<u>kindness</u> of the LORD; ***** with my mouth will I ever be showing thy truth

3 I have made a covenant <u>with my</u> chosen; * I have sworn unto <u>David my</u> servant:



4 Thy seed will I <u>stablish for</u> ever, ***** and set up thy throne from one generation <u>to a</u>nother.

5 O LORD, the very heavens shall <u>praise thy</u> wondrous works; * and thy truth in the congregation of the saints.

6 For who is <u>he among the clouds</u>, * that shall be com<u>pared un</u>to the LORD?

7 And what is <u>he among the gods</u>, * that shall be <u>like un</u>to the LORD?

8 God is very greatly to be feared in the <u>council</u> of the saints, ***** and to be had in reverence of all them that are <u>round</u> about him.

9 O Lord God of hosts, who is <u>like un</u>to thee? * thy truth, most mighty LORD, <u>is on</u> every side.

10 Thou rulest the <u>raging</u> of the sea; * thou stillest the waves thereof <u>when they</u> arise.

11 Thou hast subdued Egypt, <u>and de</u>stroyed it; * thou hast scattered thine enemies abroad <u>with thy</u> mighty arm.

12 The heavens are thine, the <u>earth al</u>so is thine; * thou hast laid the foundation of the round world, and all that therein is.

13 Thou hast made the <u>north and</u> the south; * Tabor and Hermon shall rej<u>oice in</u> thy Name.

14 Thou <u>hast a</u> mighty arm; * strong is thy hand, and <u>high is thy</u> right hand.

15 Righteousness and equity are the habi<u>tation</u> of thy seat; ***** mercy and truth shall <u>go be</u>fore thy face.



16 Blessèd is the people, O LORD, that can rejoice in thee; * they shall walk in the <u>light of</u> thy countenance.

17 Their delight shall be daily in thy <u>Name</u>; * and in thy righteousness <u>shall</u> they make their boast.

18 For thou art the glory of their <u>strength</u>, ***** and in thy loving-kindness thou shalt <u>lift</u> up our horns.

19 For the LORD is our de<u>fence;</u> * the Holy One of <u>Isra</u>el is our King.

20 Thou spakest sometime in visions unto thy saints, and <u>saidst</u>, * I have laid help upon one that is mighty,

I have exalted one chosen <u>out of</u> the people.

21 I have found David my <u>ser</u>vant; * with my holy oil have <u>I</u> anointed him.

22 My hand shall hold him <u>fast</u>, * and my <u>arm</u> shall strengthen him.

23 The enemy shall not be able to do him <u>vi</u>olence; * the son of wickedness <u>shall</u> not hurt him.

24 I will smite down his foes before his <u>face</u>, * and <u>plague them</u> that hate him.

25 My truth also and my mercy shall be <u>with</u> him; ***** and in my Name shall his <u>horn be</u> exalted.

26 I will set his dominion also in the <u>sea</u>, ***** and his right <u>hand</u> in the floods.

27 He shall call me, Thou art my <u>Fa</u>ther, * my God, and my <u>strong</u> salvation.



28 And I will make him my first<u>born</u>, ***** higher than the <u>kings</u> of the earth.

29 My mercy will I keep for him for ever<u>more</u>, ***** and my covenant <u>shall</u> stand fast with him.

30 His seed also will I make to endure for $\underline{ev}er$, * and his throne as the <u>days</u> of heaven.

31 But if his children forsake my <u>law</u>, * and walk not <u>in</u> my judgments;

32 If they break my statutes, and keep not my com<u>mand</u>ments; * I will visit their offences with the rod, and their <u>sin</u> with scourges.

33 Nevertheless, my loving-kindness will I not utterly <u>take</u> from him, * nor <u>suffer</u> my truth to fail.

34 My covenant will I not break, nor alter the thing that is gone out of my \underline{lips} : *

I have sworn once by my holiness, that I will not fail David.

35 His seed shall endure for <u>ev</u>er, * and his throne is like as the <u>sun</u> before me.

36 He shall stand fast for evermore as the <u>moon</u>, * and as the faithful <u>witness</u> in heaven.



37 *But thou* hast abhorred and forsaken <u>thine an</u>ointed, * and <u>art</u> displeased at him.

38 Thou hast broken the covenant <u>of thy</u> servant, ***** and cast his <u>crown</u> to the ground.



39 Thou hast overthrown <u>all his</u> hedges, * and broken <u>down</u> his strongholds.

40 All they that <u>go by</u> spoil him, ***** and he is become a re<u>proach to</u> his neighbours.

41 Thou hast set up the right <u>hand of his</u> enemies, ***** and made all his <u>adversar</u>ies to rejoice.

42 Thou hast taken away the <u>edge of</u> his sword, ***** and givest him not victory <u>in</u> the battle.

43 Thou hast <u>put out his</u> glory, * and cast his throne <u>down</u> to the ground.

44 The days of his youth <u>hast thou</u> shortened, * and covered him <u>with</u> dishonour.

45 LORD, how long wilt thou hide thy<u>self? for</u> ever? * and <u>shall thy</u> wrath burn like fire?

46 O remember how <u>short my</u> time is; * wherefore hast thou <u>made</u> all men for nought?

47 What man is he that liveth, and <u>shall not</u> see death? * and shall he deliver his soul from the <u>power</u> of the grave?

48 Lord, where are thy old <u>loving</u>-kindnesses, * which thou swarest unto <u>Da</u>vid in thy truth?

49 Remember, Lord, the re<u>buke that thy</u> servants have, ***** and how I do bear in my bosom the rebukes of <u>many</u> people;

50 Wherewith thine <u>enemies have</u> blasphemed thee, * and slandered the footsteps of <u>thine</u> anointed.



[51 Praised be the <u>LORD for</u> evermore. * A<u>men</u>, and Amen.]

5 As soon as thou scatterest them they are even as a <u>sleep</u>; ***** and fade away <u>suddenly</u> like the grass.

6 In the morning it is green, and groweth <u>up;</u> * but in the evening it is cut down, <u>dried up, and</u> withered.



7 For we consume away in thy dis<u>plea</u>sure, * and are afraid at thy wrathful <u>indig</u>nation.

8 Thou hast set our misdeeds be<u>fore</u> thee; * and our secret sins in the <u>light of thy</u> countenance.

9 For when thou art angry all our days are <u>gone</u>: * we bring our years to an end, as it were a <u>tale that</u> is told.

10 The days of our age are threescore years and ten; and though men be so strong that they come to fourscore <u>years</u>, * yet is their strength then but labour and sorrow; so soon passeth it a<u>way</u>, and we are gone.

11 But who regardeth the power of thy <u>wrath</u>? * or feareth aright thy <u>indignation</u>?

12 So teach us to number our <u>days</u>, * that we may apply our <u>hearts unto</u> wisdom.

13 Turn thee again, O LORD, at the <u>last</u>, * and be gracious <u>unto thy</u> servants.

14 O satisfy us with thy mercy, and that <u>soon</u>: * so shall we rejoice and be glad all the <u>days of</u> our life.

15 Comfort us again now after the time that thou hast <u>plagued</u> us; * and for the years wherein we have <u>suffered adversity</u>.

16 Show thy servants thy <u>work</u>, * and their <u>children thy</u> glory.

17 And the glorious majesty of the LORD our God be up<u>on</u> us: * prosper thou the work of our hands upon us;

O prosper thou our handy-work.



Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, <u>world without</u> end. Amen.

9 For thou, LORD, art my <u>hope</u>; * thou hast set thine house of de<u>fence ve</u>ry high.

10 There shall no evil happen <u>un</u>to thee, * neither shall any plague come <u>nigh thy</u> dwelling.

11 For he shall give his angels <u>charge</u> over thee, ***** to keep <u>thee in</u> all thy ways.

12 They shall bear thee in their <u>hands</u>, * that thou hurt not thy <u>foot against a stone</u>.

13 Thou shalt go upon the lion and <u>ad</u>der: * the young lion and the dragon shalt thou tread <u>under</u> thy feet.

14 Because he hath set his love upon me, therefore will I de<u>li</u>ver him; *

I will set him up, be<u>cause he hath</u> known my Name.

15 He shall call upon me, and I will <u>hear</u> him; * yea, I am with him in trouble;

I will deliver him, and <u>bring him to</u> honour.

16 With long life will I <u>sa</u>tisfy him, * and show him <u>my sal</u>vation.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be,

world without end. Amen.



It *is* a good thing to give thanks unto <u>the</u> LORD, ***** and to sing praises unto thy <u>Name, O</u> Most Highest;

8 For lo, thine enemies, O LORD, lo, thine enemies <u>shall</u> perish; * and all the workers of wick<u>edness</u> shall be destroyed.

9 But my horn shall be exalted like the horn of <u>an</u> unicorn; * for I am <u>anointed</u> with fresh oil.

10 Mine eye also shall see his lust of <u>mine</u> enemies, * and mine ear shall hear his desire of the wicked that <u>arise up</u> against me.

11 The righteous shall flourish like <u>a</u> palm-tree, * and shall spread abroad like <u>a cedar</u> in Lebanon.



12 Such as are planted in the house of <u>the</u> LORD, * shall flourish in the courts of <u>the house</u> of our God.

13 They also shall bring forth more fruit in <u>their</u> age, * and shall <u>be fat and</u> well-liking;

14 That they may show how true the LORD \underline{my} strength is, * and that there is no $\underline{unrighteous}$ ness in him.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

3 Ever since the world began, hath thy seat been pre<u>pared</u>: * thou art from <u>ev</u>erlasting.

4 The floods are risen, O LORD, the floods have lift up their <u>voice</u>; * the floods <u>lift</u> up their waves.

5 The waves of the sea are mighty, and rage <u>hor</u>ribly; ***** but yet the LORD, who dwelleth on <u>high</u>, is mightier.



6 Thy testimonies, O LORD, are very <u>sure</u>: * holiness becometh thine <u>house</u> for ever.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be,





19 Until the time came that his cause <u>was</u> known: * <u>the word of the</u> LORD tried him.

20 The king sent, and <u>de</u>livered him; * the prince of the peo<u>ple let</u> him go free.

21 He made him lord also of <u>his</u> house, * and ruler <u>of all</u> his substance;

22 That he might inform his princes after <u>his</u> will, * and teach <u>his sena</u>tors wisdom.

23 Israel also came in<u>to</u> Egypt, * and Jacob was a strang<u>er in</u> the land of Ham.

24 And he increased his people <u>ex</u>ceedingly, * and made them strong<u>er than</u> their enemies;

25 Whose heart turned so, that they hated <u>his</u> people, * and dealt untruly with his servants.

26 Then sent he Moses $\underline{\text{his}}$ servant, * and Aaron whom he had chosen.

27 And these showed his tokens <u>among</u> them, ***** and won<u>ders in</u> the land of Ham.



28 He *sent* darkness, <u>and it</u> was dark; * and they were not o- | bedi-ent | unto | his word.

29 He turned their <u>waters</u> into blood, * and | *slew* | *their* | fish.

30 Their <u>land brought</u> forth frogs; * yea, even | in their | *kings*' | chambers.

31 He spake the word, and there came all <u>manner</u> of flies, * and | lice in | all their | quarters.

32 He gave them <u>hailstones</u> for rain; * and | flames of | fire in | their land.

33 He smote their <u>vines also and</u> fig-trees; * and destroyed the | trees that were | in their | coasts.

34 He spake the word, and the grasshoppers came, and <u>caterpillars</u> <u>in</u>numerable, * and did eat up all the grass in their land,

and devoured the | fruit of | *their* | ground.

35 He smote all the first<u>born in</u> their land; * even the | chief of | all their | strength.

36 He brought them forth also with <u>silver</u> and gold; * there was not one feeble | person a - | mong their | tribes.

37 Egypt was glad at <u>their de</u>parting; * for | they were ·a- | fraid of | them.

38 He spread out a cloud to <u>be a</u> covering, ***** and fire to give light | in the | *night* | season.



39 At their de<u>sire he</u> brought quails; ***** and he filled them | with the | bread of | heaven.

40 He opened the rock of stone, and the <u>waters</u> flowed out, * so that rivers | ran in the | *dry* | places.



41 For why? he remembered his holy <u>pro</u>mise; ***** and Abraham his servant.

42 And he brought forth his people with joy, * and his <u>chosen</u> with gladness;

43 And gave them the lands of the <u>hea</u>then; ***** and they took the labours of the people <u>in</u> possession;

44 That they might keep his <u>sta</u>tutes, ***** and ob<u>serve</u> his laws.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit; * As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

2 Who can express the noble acts of the <u>LORD</u>, * or <u>show</u> forth all his praise?

3 Blessèd are they that alway keep judgment, * and do righteousness.

4 Remember me, O LORD, according to the favour that thou bearest unto thy <u>people</u>; *

O visit me with <u>thy</u> salvation;

5 That I may see the felicity of thy <u>cho</u>sen, * and rejoice in the gladness of thy people, and give thanks with <u>thine</u> inheritance.

6 We have sinned with our <u>fa</u>thers; ***** we have done amiss, <u>and</u> dealt wickedly.

7 Our fathers regarded not thy wonders in Egypt, neither kept they thy great goodness in re<u>mem</u>brance; * but were disobedient at the sea, even <u>at</u> the Red Sea.

8 Nevertheless, he helped them for his <u>Name's</u> sake, * that he might make his <u>pow</u>er to be known.

9 He rebuked the Red Sea also, and it was dried <u>up;</u> * so he led them through the deep, as <u>through</u> a wilderness.

10 And he saved them from the adversary's <u>hand</u>, ***** and delivered them from the <u>hand of</u> the enemy.

11 As for those that troubled them, the waters over<u>whelm</u>ed them; * there was not <u>one</u> of them left.

12 Then believed they his <u>words</u>, * and sang <u>praise</u> unto him.



13 But *with*in a while they forgat his works, * and would not <u>abide</u> his counsel.

14 But lust came upon them <u>in the</u> wilderness, * and they tempt<u>ed God in</u> the desert.

15 And he gave them <u>their de</u>sire, * and sent leanness <u>withal</u> into their soul.

16 They angered Moses also <u>in the</u> tents, ***** and Aaron <u>the saint</u> of the LORD.

17 So the earth opened, and <u>swallowed up</u> Dathan, * and covered the congregation of Abiram.

18 And the fire was kindled <u>in their</u> company; * the flame <u>burnt up the</u> ungodly.

19 They made a <u>calf in</u> Horeb, ***** and worshipped <u>the molt</u>en image.

20 Thus they <u>turned their</u> glory * into the similitude of <u>a calf</u> that eateth hay.

21 And they forgat <u>God their</u> Saviour, * who had done so <u>great things</u> in Egypt;

22 Wondrous works in the <u>land of</u> Ham; * and fear<u>ful things by</u> the Red Sea.

23 So he said he would have destroyed them, had not Moses his chosen stood before him <u>in the gap</u>, * to turn away his wrathful indignation,

lest he should destroy them.



24 Yea, they thought scorn of that <u>pleasant</u> land, * and gave no cred<u>ence un</u>to his word;

25 But murmured <u>in their</u> tents, * and hearkened not unto <u>the voice</u> of the LORD.

26 Then lift he up his <u>hand against them</u>, ***** to overthrow <u>them in</u> the wilderness;

27 To cast out their seed a<u>mong the</u> nations, * and <u>to scatter</u> them in the lands.

28 They joined themselves un<u>to Baal</u>-peor, ***** and ate <u>the offer</u>ings of the dead.

29 Thus they provoked him to anger with their <u>own in</u>ventions; * and the plague <u>was great</u> among them.

30 Then stood up Phinehas, and <u>interposed</u>; * <u>and so</u> the plague ceased.

31 And that was counted unto <u>him for</u> righteousness, ***** among all poste<u>rities</u> for evermore.



32 They angered him also at the waters of <u>strife</u>, * so that he punished <u>Mo</u>ses for their sakes;

33 Because they provoked his <u>spi</u>rit, * so that he spake unad<u>vised</u>ly with his lips.

34 Neither destroyed they the <u>hea</u>then, * as the <u>LORD</u> commanded them;



35 But were mingled among the <u>hea</u>then, * <u>and</u> learned their works.

36 Insomuch that they worshipped their idols, which became a <u>snare</u> unto them; * yea, they offered their sons and their daughters <u>un</u>to devils;

37 And shed innocent blood, even the blood of their sons and of their <u>daugh</u>ters, * whom they offered unto the idols of Canaan;

and the land was defiled with blood.

38 Thus were they stained with their own <u>works</u>, ***** and went a whoring with their <u>own</u> inventions.

39 Therefore was the wrath of the LORD kindled against his <u>people</u>, ***** insomuch that he abhorred his <u>own</u> inheritance.

40 And he gave them over into the hand of the <u>hea</u>then; * and they that hated them were <u>lords</u> over them.

41 Their enemies oppressed them, * and had them <u>in</u> subjection.

42 Many a time did he de<u>li</u>ver them; *but they rebelled against him with their own inventions, and were brought down <u>in</u> their wickedness.

43 Nevertheless, when he saw their ad<u>ver</u>sity, * he <u>heard</u> their complaint.

44 He thought upon his covenant,

and pitied them, according unto the multitude of his <u>mer</u>cies; * yea, he made all those that led them away <u>captive</u> to pity them.



45 Deliver us, O LORD our God, and gather us from among the <u>hea</u>then; * that we may give thanks unto thy holy Name, and make our <u>boast</u> of thy praise.

[46 Blessèd be the LORD God of Israel, from everlasting, and world without <u>end;</u> * And let all the <u>people</u> say, Amen.]

11 Because they rebelled a- | gainst the | words of the | Lord, * and lightly regarded the | counsel | of the Most | Highest;

12 He also brought | down their | heart through | heaviness: * they fell down, and | there was | none to | help them.

13 So when they cried unto the |*LORD*| in their trouble, * he delivered them | out of | their dis- | *tress*.

14 For he brought them out of darkness, and | out of the | shadow of | death, * and | brake their | bonds in | sunder.

15 O that men would therefore | praise the | LORD for his | goodness; * and declare the wonders that he doeth | for the | child-ren | of men!



16 For he hath | broken the | gates of | brass, * and smitten the | bars of | iron in | sunder.



17 Foolish men are plagued for their of<u>fence</u>, * and be<u>cause of</u> their wickedness.

18 Their soul abhorred all manner of $\underline{\text{meat}}$, * and they were even $\underline{\text{hard}}$ at death's door.

19 So when they cried unto the LORD in their $\underline{\text{trou}}$ ble, * he delivered them $\underline{\text{out}}$ of their distress.

20 He sent his word, and <u>healed</u> them; * and they were saved from <u>their</u> destruction.

21 O that men would therefore praise the LORD for his <u>goodness</u>; * and declare the wonders that he doeth for the <u>child</u>ren of men !

22 That they would offer unto him the sacrifice of thanks<u>giv</u>ing, * and tell out his <u>works</u> with gladness!

23 They that go down to the sea in <u>ships</u>, * and occupy their business <u>in</u> great waters;

24 These men see the works of the <u>LORD</u>, * and his <u>won</u>ders in the deep.

25 For at his word the stormy wind a<u>ri</u>seth, * which lifteth <u>up</u> the waves thereof.

26 They are carried up to the heaven, and down again to the <u>deep</u>; * their soul melteth away be<u>cause of</u> the trouble.



27 They reel to and fro, and stagger like a $\underline{\text{drunk}}$ en man, * and are $\underline{\text{at}}$ their wit's end.


28 So when they cry unto the LORD in their <u>trou</u>ble, * he delivereth them <u>out</u> of their distress.

38 He blesseth them, so that they | multi- | ply ex- | ceedingly; * and suffereth not their | cattle | to de- | *crease*.

39 And again, when they are | minished | and brought | low * through oppression, through | any | plague or | trouble;

40 Though he suffer them to be | evil·en- | treated·through | tyrants, * and let them wander out of the | *way* | in the | wild-erness;

41 Yet helpeth he the | *poor* | out of | misery, * and maketh him households | like a | flock of | *sheep*.

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42 The righteous will con-|sider this, | and re-|joice; * and the mouth of all | wicked-ness | shall be | stopped.
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43 Whoso is | wise, will | ponder these | things; * and they shall understand the loving- | kindness | of the | *LORD*.

10 Let the extortioner consume all that he <u>hath</u>; * and let the stranger <u>spoil his</u> labour.

11 Let there be no man to <u>pi</u>ty him, * nor to have compassion upon his <u>fatherless</u> children.



12 Let his posterity be de<u>stroyed</u>; ***** and in the next generation let his <u>name be</u> clean put out.

13 Let the wickedness of his fathers be had in remembrance in the sight of the <u>LORD</u>; * and let not the sin of his <u>mother be</u> done away.

14 Let them alway be before the <u>LORD</u>, * that he may root out the memorial of <u>them from</u> off the earth;

15 And that, because his mind was not to do good; * but persecuted the poor helpless man,

that he might slay him that was vexed at the heart.

16 His delight was in cursing, and it shall happen unto <u>him</u>; * he loved not blessing, therefore shall <u>it be</u> far from him.

17 He clothed himself with cursing like as with a <u>raiment</u>, * and it shall come into his bowels like water, and like <u>oil in</u>to his bones.

24 I am become also a re<u>proach</u> unto them: * they that look up<u>on me</u> shake their heads.

27 Though they curse, yet <u>bless</u> thou; * and let them be confounded that rise up against me;

but let thy <u>servant</u> rejoice.

28 Let mine adversaries be clothed with <u>shame</u>; * and let them cover themselves with their own confusion, <u>as with</u> a cloak.

29 As for me, I will give great thanks unto the LORD with my <u>mouth</u>, * and praise him a<u>mong the</u> multitude;

30 For he shall stand at the right hand of the <u>poor</u>, ***** to save his soul from un<u>righteous</u> judges.







5 Such knowledge is too wonderful and <u>excellent</u> for me; * I cannot <u>attain</u> unto it.

6 Whither shall I go then <u>from thy</u> Spirit? * or whither shall I go <u>then from</u> thy presence?

7 If I climb up into heaven, <u>thou art</u> there; * if I go down to hell, <u>thou art</u> there also.

8 If I take the <u>wings of the</u> morning, ***** and remain in the utter<u>most parts</u> of the sea;

9 Even there also <u>shall thy hand</u> lead me, * and thy <u>right hand</u> shall hold me.

10 If I say, Peradventure the <u>darkness shall</u> cover me; * then shall <u>my night</u> be turned to day.

11 Yea, the darkness is no darkness with thee, but the night is as <u>clear as the</u> day; * the darkness and light <u>to thee</u> are both alike.



12 For my <u>reins are</u> thine; * thou hast co<u>vered me in</u> my mother's womb.

13 I will give thanks unto thee, for I am fearfully and <u>wonderfully</u> made: * marvellous are thy works,

and that my soul know eth right well.

14 My bones <u>are not</u> hid from thee, * though I be made secretly, and fashioned <u>beneath</u> in the earth.

15 Thine eyes did see my substance, yet <u>being imp</u>erfect; ***** and in thy book were all <u>my mem</u>bers written;

16 Which day by <u>day were</u> fashioned, * when <u>as yet there</u> was none of them.

17 How dear are thy counsels unto <u>me, O</u> God; * O <u>how great is</u> the sum of them!

18 If I tell them, they are more in number <u>than the</u> sand: * when I wake up, I <u>am pre</u>sent with thee.

19 Wilt thou not slay the <u>wicked, O</u> God? * Depart from me, <u>ye blood</u>-thirsty men.

20 For they speak un<u>righteously against thee</u>; ***** and thine ene<u>mies take</u> thy Name in vain.

21 Do not I hate them, O LORD, <u>that hate</u> thee? * and am not I grieved with those <u>that rise up</u> against thee?

22 Yea, I hate <u>them</u> right sore; * even as though <u>they were</u> mine enemies.



23 Try me, O God, and seek the <u>ground of my</u> heart; * prove me, and <u>examine my</u> thoughts.

3 They have sharpened their tongues like a <u>serpent</u>; * adder's poison is <u>under</u> their lips.







INTRODUCTION

Singing English texts to the ancient Latin psalm tones is a tricky business. Lines of English text end with oxytones or stressed monosyllables far more frequently than in the Latin. On the other hand, a few English lines end with a long tail of relatively unstressed syllables, whether in a phrase such as "too míghty for me" or a single word such as "wickednesses," also highly unusual in Latin. English relies on the stresses to determine timing of recitation, with results quite dissimilar to the steady forward motion of the Latin. Though it is plainly unsatisfactory to simply apply the rules of the Latin prosody without modification, in many cases the necessary adjustments multiply until our chant tones begin to look like subway maps! The practical ideal is likely to be a result of simplifying rather than complicating the Latin tones. In developing this new approach, I have tried to follow these principles:

1. The inflections of psalm chanting in English should be primarily syllabic, i.e. no more than one note per syllable. The fixed neumed/slurred note groups of the Latin tones are either avoided altogether or handled in the manner of Anglican chant, where a slur can be retained or discarded according to the needs of the text. *Italic* typeface indicates syllables belonging to a two-note slur. The intonations of the psalm tones 1, 3, 4, 6, and 7 contain these optional slurs.

2. The points of accent in the Latin tones should be retained as much as possible, such that the overall character of each tone remains recognizable. To achieve this, I have used what might be called subsidiary reciting tones. The *tenors* (or *reciting notes*) of the original chants are written as hollow or "white" notes, indicating that they can take as many syllables as necessary until the next pointing mark in the text. In addition to these, the final note of each mediant and terminating cadence can also take as many "throw-away" syllables as necessary. Finally, most terminations and some mediants have an internal reciting note that can take a few extra syllables as needed to fit the text. As complicated as this sounds, the only pointing mark needed is underlining of the text corresponding with brackets in the chant, dividing each line of text into three parts: The main reciting tone before the underlining; the first part of the cadence within the underlining, invariably involving a primary textual accent; and the second part of the cadence where the underlining ceases, sometimes involving a "floating" textual accent that can occur at various points in the chant. I have seen a similar but not identical approach in the recent work of David Clayton.

3. More elaborate cadential formulas should be recast as Anglican chant cadences, so as to provide for ad hoc slurs. I have taken this approach for tone 3 and the termination of tone 1. Since the Anglican chant pointing is more complicated than that used for the rest of the tones, these tones are rarely employed in the body of the psalter, probably being more suitable for the frequently re-used canticles.

4. The original tenor of tone 3 (B rather than C) is preferred.

5. Line breaks with indentation supplement the asterisk as indications of major pauses. By now this is the prevalent way of arranging the psalms for recitation and singing, even though it requires more space.

6. Decorative elements such as the flex should be provided for but not enforced. Opportunities for the flex are much rarer in English, and anyone seriously interested in applying it is not likely to have need of pointing to do so. The same goes for other "local options" such as repeating the intonation for the Gloria Patri whenever it appears.

The following page contains a table of all the tones, showing the invariable accent. The "floating" accent is not marked, but normally occurs on the penultimate note in all but tone 2.





















HOW TO SING THE PSALMS



1. A psalm tone is divided into five sequential parts: an intonation, a tenor or reciting tone, a mediant cadence, another reciting tone, and a termination. In tone 2 above, the C and D constitute the intonation, the first F is a reciting tone, and the G and parenthesized F make the mediant cadence. After the double bar (which corresponds to the asterisk in the text), the F appears again as a reciting tone, and the E, C, and D are the terminating cadence.

2. The *Intonation*, marked off by a dotted bar line, is used only for the first verse of a psalm. Usually one individual sings the first halfverse alone, and sets a pitch level in whatever range is comfortable for the group. When the music is reprinted at the top of a new page, the intonation is omitted to remind the singer not to use it. The Gospel canticles, *Magnificat*, *Nunc dimittis*, and *Benedictus*, are an exception—in them the intonation is used for the beginning of all the verses. The intonation should also be used again when the tone changes part-way through a lengthy psalm. In tones 1, 3, 4, and 6, the initial syllable of the line may need to be lengthened a bit to properly balance a slurred second syllable, at the cantor's discretion.

3. White notes can take as many syllables as necessary. Black notes always take exactly one syllable. The brackets above the staff indicate which notes are used for underlined portions of the text. In tone 2, the mediant will always have exactly one underlined syllable, on G. The F following the G will take any unaccented syllables following the underlined syllable, or else it will be omitted. For the termination, the bracketed white note means that more than one syllable might be underlined, and therefore sung on E. When the underlining ceases in the text, two or more syllables will remain to complete the termination.


4. The asterisk always implies a pause for a leisurely breath. A similar pause should be observed between verses when the psalm is sung by all singers together. It is more common to alternate verses between two halves of a choir, between high (i.e. female or immature male) voices and male voices, or between a cantor and congregation. In any of these cases, the pause between verses can be more-or-less dispensed with. Excessively long lines are divided by line break and indentation, and a short pause should be observed here as well. But do not pause at a line break without a indentation or asterisk.

According to these principles, the first verse in the psalter,

Blessèd is the man that hath not walked in the counsel of the ungodly,

nor stood in the way of <u>sin</u>ners, * and hath not sat in the <u>seat of</u> the scornful.

would be sung something like this:



5. In tones 1 and 3, and in the intonations of several other tones, it is possible to sing two notes to one syllable in certain places. This is invariably indicated with *Italic* typeface. Anglican chant pointing is used in tones 1 and 3. For these, the vertical bar | in the text corresponds to the barline in the music, and dots indicate distribution of the words where it is unclear.

6. It is very important to prioritize the natural speaking rhythms of the text at all times. The floating accent of the more complex terminations sometimes poses a stumbling block, but so long as the singer is careful to draw out the primary accents, the result should be satisfactory. On the whole, the speed of recitation should be slightly faster than normal reading, with a slight slowing down through each cadence. Crash not into the cadences, neither hesitate ye, but rather ease into them naturally. On the whole, the experience should be relaxed and meditative, neither hurrying nor tarrying, in no wise fussy or melodramatic.

7. A punctuation mark never of itself implies a complete pause for breath; these are provided for by indented line breaks and asterisks. Rather, punctuation can be acknowledged either by a slight lift in the sound—not enough for breath—or else a distinct lengthening of the accented syllable immediately before the punctuation in question. In short vocative clauses beginning with *O*, the preceding punctuation should be ignored; for instance, singing "Ponder my words, O LORD, consider my meditation," one would lengthen only the word *LORD*.

8. For an entirely satisfactory result throughout the psalter, some ad hoc rhythmic adjustments will need to be occasionally applied. In places where an unaccented note is slurred, the preceeding accented syllable can simply be lengthened a little (e.g. Glory at the end of the Benedictus and Magnificat in tones 1, 3, 4, and 6). In general, the rhythm should hew very closely to the natural speaking rhythm of the text, at a tempo only slightly slower.

9. The word *victuals* is pronounced "vittles"; *saith* as "seth," not "sayeth"; *scourge* so as to rhyme with *urge*; and *tush* so as to rhyme with *rush* (rather than *push*, which would cause serious misunderstanding).

10. The *Benedictus* and *Magnificat* are presented in all the tones to facilitate their use with antiphons, which are available in Winfred

Douglas' *Monastic Diurnal Noted* and in many other adaptations. The most commonly used antiphons for *Nunc dimittis* are included in full settings, being relatively few in number. The psalm settings are not designed to be used with antiphons, since each psalm would need to be set in multiple tones.

11. There are several methods of distributing the singing among multiple singers or choirs. Most of these involve alternating by verse in some way. Alternating between a single experienced cantor and the rest of the choir or congregation is usually the most effective for educational purposes. Perhaps the most common practice is to divide into roughly equal choirs, usually facing each other on either side of a room. In this case, a cantor should still sing at least the first half-verse as a solo before his side of the choir joins in. One might also consider dividing according to voice-type, with mature male voices on one side and female and immature male voices on the other; the alternation between a lower and upper octave can be quite attractive. The Gospel canticles, *Benedictus, Magnificat* and *Nunc dimittis,* are customarily sung in unison by all.

12. The ideal configuration for a choir singing these psalms, it seems to me, is for the cantor to sing the first verse with the cantor's side joining in on the second half of it, then alternating by verse with the opposite side until the *Gloria Patri*. There the cantor alone sings the half-verse "Glory be to the Father..."—perhaps using the intonation formula—and is answered by both halves of the choir singing "As it was in the beginning..." in unison. In this way a sense of finality can be achieved that is often lacking when psalms are sung without antiphons. The same method can be applied to the Gospel canticles. It is for this reason that the *Gloria Patri* has been condensed into a single "verse," though most other English Psalters expand it to two "verses."

13. It is slightly more satisfying musically for the mediant cadence in the *Gloria Patri* to be heard complete, and not abbreviated as it must be for an oxytonic line ending. Accordingly, the Germanic *Ghost* has

been replaced by the Latin *Spirit* in the text. If *Ghost* is desired, the pointing can be modified without too much trouble.

14. Finally: experienced chanters may be interested in using the *flex*, which is a decorative line ending formula that can only occur before the mediant cadence. It can be applied to unaccented syllables at the end of the very first line of a verse when an indented line break follows it. In tones 1, 3, 4, 6, 7, and 9, the pitch for these syllables drops one whole step below the preceding tenor. In tones 2, 5, and 8, it drops a minor third. The flex cannot be applied to accented final syllables; consequently, opportunities to use the flex are not as common in English as they are in Latin. In general, the music works well enough without the flex, so I have left it unmarked. Advanced chanters can figure it out easily enough.
