The new McMaster Master of Public Policy (MPP) in a Digital Society program involves a unique coteaching model which pairs reputed academics with accomplished practitioners to provide students with both a scholarly and professional perspective on complex policy issues.

The aim of the program is to train prospective policy leaders to navigate the rapidly changing dynamics of the technological landscape to more effectively address the complex social, political, and economic challenges that have accompanied the Digital Age.

As a graduate, you should expect to leverage the program's interdisciplinary training as both a policymaker and technologist to bridge gaps within the public, private and community sectors.

Program Information

Overview

The Master of Public Policy in Digital Society is a professional graduate degree program that offers an innovative curriculum which seeks to bridge public policy thinking with technical expertise. The program trains prospective policy leaders to navigate the rapidly changing dynamics of the technological landscape to more effectively address the complex social, political, and economic challenges that have accompanied the digital age.

The MPP in Digital Society employs an innovative approach to learning which involves a mix of formats including traditional seminar-style courses, skills development labs, and professional development workshops. Collectively these formats allow for self-directed, team-based, experiential learning opportunities that address real-world problems and which draw on McMaster's signature problem-based learning approach.

The program welcomes applicants who have completed an undergraduate degree in fields such as political science, economics, sociology, communication studies, public policy, public administration, judicial studies, psychology, computer science, engineering, information science or related disciplines.

Duration of Study

The Master of Public Policy in Digital Society is a full-time program which runs from May to April.

Degree Requirements

The MPP in Digital society is a coursework-based program. Students will complete three semesters across 12 continuous months. Each semester is a four-month term consisting of three 3-unit seminar courses and three 1.5 unit skills development labs for a total course load of 13.5 units per semester. All seminars and skills development labs are required for graduation from the program. No electives are offered.

Skills Development Labs

Skills labs are a unique offering of McMasters MPP in Digital Society Program. A complement to traditional, seminar-style graduate courses, the labs are intended to develop leadership capabilities and core digital competencies such as the fundamentals of programming and data analysis.

No prior experience in coding or statistics is required to participate in the skills labs. They are tailored for novice learners.

Skills labs are graded as pass, fail, or pass with distinction.

Protocol for Instructor being late to Zoom

If a Zoom class has not started within 15 minutes of the class time and there has been no correspondence from the instructor via email or A2L, students can leave class and assume that there is an extenuating circumstance that warrants a make-up class. A student can email the Instructor and CC the Academic Director and Program Executive Director regarding the cancellation of class.

Tuition & Supplementary Fees

The tuition fees for Canadians/Permanent Residency in the MPP-DS program is \$9,700/term. There are three terms, therefore total tuition is \$29,100.

International Tuition is \$18,500/term. There are three terms, therefore total tuition is \$55,500.

Supplementary Fee Change Effective Fall 2022:

In recognition of the current online nature of the program, we are adapting our model to charge students in the program the rate charged to part-time graduate students, which is approximately 50% of the full-time rate (the fee schedule will now convey a "part-time/online" rate).

When the nature of the program changes in the future (ie. more in-person components), the fee structure will be re-evaluated at that time.

Financial Aid

Internal Scholarships

Students to whom we offer admissions are automatically considered for financial assistance in the form of a graduate scholarship. No special forms need to be filled out. Funding is awarded on academic excellence and the availability of funds. Funding is open to all domestic and international students.

Please note: The MPP program does not receive funding from the Province of Ontario, therefore there are some limitations regarding eligibility for funding, including the inability for students to leverage an OSAP grant. However, in addition to entrance scholarships, students are encouraged to use McMaster's platform "Award Spring" which matches students with available relevant funding opportunities. Award Spring is only accessible to current students; incoming students may not have access until August.

McMaster Bursaries

MPP graduate students who demonstrate financial need can apply for the McMaster Graduate General Bursary Program.

Please note: The McMaster Graduate General Bursary Program is not open to international students enrolled in graduate studies, MBA, medicine or physician assistant programs.

Students in the MPP are also eligible for the Rainbow Fund. By demonstrating financial need and applying to the General Bursary, students will automatically be considered for certain bursaries like the Rainbow Fund Bursary (to be considered for the Rainbow Fund Bursary the student must also self-identify as 2SLGBTQIA+ in the main AwardSpring application).

If you wish to apply, you will be asked to submit financial information and documents through <u>AwardSpring</u>. That information will be assessed by the Office of the Registrar to confirm if the student demonstrates financial need. If it is determined they have financial need, a financial need score will be assigned.

The 2022-23 General Bursary application opens mid-August and closes mid-January. MPP-DS students need to fill out a form that mimics the questions OSAP asks. It is recommended to complete this form well before the deadline to allow time for review by Financial Aid staff. The Office of the Registrar will then provide SGS relevant information concerning students with a financial need score so SGS can determine if the student qualifies for the General Bursary.

Wilson Leadership Scholar Award (WLSA)

We also refer students to the Wilson Leadership Scholar Award. There are up to a total of 10 awards available each year, valued at \$12,000 in direct funding and up to \$2,000 in experiential funding. Each cohort will include both undergraduate and graduate students.

Students can apply via <u>AwardSpring</u>, and applicants will be required to demonstrate financial need through an assessment that is similar to OSAP's.

Be on an uncluttered background and of you alone (no other people, animals, etc permitted in the photo).

Must <u>not</u> contain any props (no hats, sunglasses, or graduation caps)

Maximum photo size must be 3MB or less to be successfully uploaded.

Uploaded photos not meeting the above criteria will be deleted, resulting in delays in receiving your student card.
