VI. Faculty of Social Sciences Graduate Curriculum and Policy Committee Report

Dr. Horn presented the item, noting that there was a request to add a co-op stream for the Master of Public Policy program.

IX. Cotutelle

Dr. Gupta presented the item. He noted that the policy and the changes in the procedures were presented at a previous meeting with good discussion. The changes involve creating a flowchart that makes things clearer. The letter of intent has also been modified and some relatively minor changes were made to the policy, including taking on board some feedback noted at the previous meeting about time spent at another institution.

It was duly moved and seconded, that the Graduate Council approve, for recommendation to Senate as appropriate, the report from the Cotutelle Working Group and the changes to the Cotutelle Policy as set out in the documents.

X. Policy on Postdoctoral Fellows

Dr. Hranilovic noted that this item had come forward for information previously. A member asked for a point of clarification, noting that it appears from the wording in section 5 that the policy envisages part-time post doc is possible and asked if that was correct. Dr. Hranilovic responded that that was a new point to him as well and said given the fundamental nature of the question that the discussion be tabled until the fall.
