### VII. Faculty of Humanities Graduate Curriculum and Policy Committee Report

Dr. Horn presented the item, noting that the MCM professional program had been running for quite some time and for the duration it has been offered in partnership with Syracuse. Syracuse informed McMaster that they were no longer wanted to participate and this necessitated a change. They are comfortable with the update given that McMaster has controlled the majority of the program content. For students who entered the program in the fall of 2023, their parchment will no longer include Syracuse. The rest of the program content remains the same.

Members discussed impact for the current cohort. Dr. Horn noted that there hadn't been any concerns expressed by students.

It was duly moved and seconded, 'that Graduate Council approve, for recommendation to Senate as appropriate, the change proposed by the Faculty of Humanites, as described in the documents.'

A member expanded on the update from Dr. Verma, noting that the Degroote Doctoral Student Associate was holding a research date on March 4<sup>th</sup> and running a competition related to the commercialization of research. ### Admission Requirements/Required Documentation

Applicants must have an Honours Bachelor's degree or equivalent with a cumulative grade point average (over the whole length of the degree) of at least B+. In addition, they must have an average of B+ in their last year of relevant courses. Students with an undergraduate



degree in business, economics, or any quantitative-oriented field are good candidates for this program. Students from other fields are welcome to apply and they are highly encouraged to complete at least a few relevant finance, economics, statistics, and math courses.

- 1. Completed on-line application form (Please see a link to the form on http://mfin.degroote.mcmaster.ca/apply/)
- 2. Unofficial transcripts of all postsecondary education completed and in progress. If an offer is extended to the applicant, one of the conditions will be to request the official transcripts to be sent directly from the issuing institutions.
- 3. An official GMAT score report. Normally, a minimum score of 600 is required. In lieu of the GMAT, the program will consider a GRE test with a score above the 50th percentile in the quantitative reasoning section.
- 3. A test report for one of these following tests:
  - 1. GMAT test with a minimum total score of 600 and a quantitative percentile of at least 50%.
  - 2. GMAT Focus Edition test with a minimum total score of 555 and a quantitative percentile of at least 50%.
  - 3. GRE test with at least 50% in quantitative reasoning
- 4. Two letters of recommendation, with at least one from an academic source. Please note that McMaster University uses the Electronic Referencing System. By entering the email address of your referee through the online application, the system will automatically send an eReference request on your behalf.
- 5. An official report of a TOEFL score or an IELTS score (for applicants whose native language is not English). A minimum TOEFL score of 92 (internet-based test) or IELTS score of 6.5 is required. Applicants who have completed a university degree for which English is the language of instruction may be exempted from this requirement.
- 6. Participation in a video interview.

We would like to include a note in the Grad Calendar (<u>Program: Business Administration, Ph.D.-McMaster University (romcmaster.ca)</u>) under "Comprehensive Examination" to remind students receiving two failures in Comprehensive Examinations that they will be withdrawn from their degree program. There is no option to switch to another PhD field of Specialization and continue in the Business PhD program.

Rationale for the Recommended Change (How does the requirement fit into the department's program and/or tie to existing Program Learning Outcomes from the program's IQAP cyclical review?):

Aligning with what is already established on Regulations for Degree Progression - McMaster University (romcmaster.ca) "A Comprehensive Examination or alternative assessment of comprehensive knowledge must include a provision for second opportunity for assessment should the student fail the first attempt. This second assessment is given in place of any "reread" of a comprehensive evaluation, which is explicitly excluded from the Student Appeal Procedures. The second opportunity will normally occur between one to six months after the student was notified that they had failed the original assessment. It is preferred that it occur within the first month of a term. A failure at the second assessment will require the student to withdraw from the program. If the student decides not to take up the option of the second attempt then the failure stands."

Comprehensive Examination:

All doctoral candidates must pass a comprehensive examination in their chosen field of study to demonstrate knowledge of the field and preparation for research. The comprehensive examination will test each student's knowledge of core material, familiarity with the relevant literature and knowledge of methodology required to do research in the field. The comprehensive examinations in the Accounting, MOBHR and Marketing fields include a written examination followed by an oral examination. The comprehensive exam in Finance consists of a written exam (in two parts) and a research paper proposal. The comprehensive examination in all other fields includes only a written examination.

In addition to the comprehensive examination, students must pass an oral defence of their dissertation proposals before they can proceed to the final oral defence of their dissertation. The dissertation examination will take place in accordance with the regulations of the School of Graduate Studies.

PhD students receiving two failures in Comprehensive Examinations will be withdrawn from their degree program. These students are not allowed to switch to another Business PhD field of Specialization.



#### Admission Requirements

- Degree: Completion of an Honours Bachelor's degree from a recognized university
- GPA: Recommended B average (equivalent to a McMaster 8.0 GPA out of 12) or higher. GPA will be calculated using the two most recent years of undergraduate or graduate study, 20 courses, or the equivalent of 60 academic credits. A combination may be used and is determined on a case-by-case basis.
- GMAT: Not required. Candidates who fail to meet the above GPA criteria or who wish to strengthen their application may wish to submit a GMAT.
  - GMAT is required for non-degree applicants. See Admission Requirements.
- Proof of English Language Proficiency: Required for applicants:
  - Whose previous degree was not completed with the language of instruction of English.
  - Who have been resident in an English-speaking country for less than four years.
  - Who have completed less than three years of full-time post-secondary education with English as the primary language of instruction, excluding ESL courses.
- Acceptable English Language Proficiency Tests:
  - Academic IELTS
  - **TOEFL**
- **Work Experience**: Recommended minimum of 4 years post-graduate work experience.
- References: Applicants are encouraged to seek two professional (current or former direct supervisor or manger) references. Academic reference can be submitted if two professional are not available.
- **Interview**: Applicants are required to complete an online interview prior to submission of their application.



This name change will help us as a department to proactively address tensions noted in our last IQAP report related to the relationship between literary studies and cultural studies. In that report, external reviewers report confusion amongst students regarding how these two modes of inquiry speak to one another, as well as worries among faculty members that both approaches are not valued equally within our departmental culture.

The current name for our English PhD inadvertently reinforces divisions eschewed by our departmental name change from over a decade ago. Renaming the PhD (simultaneously with renaming our newly merged MA programme with two streams) will address this unintended problem, affirming our commitment to productive synergies across literary and cultural studies.

Rationale for the Recommended Change (How does the requirement fit into the department's program and/or tie to existing Program Learning Outcomes from the program's IQAP cyclical review?):

In 2021, the department eliminated the thesis option for the English MA due, among other factors, to lack of supervisory capacity. However, many of our strongest English MA applicants propose well-defined independent research projects; indeed, those who apply for SSHRC CGS-M are required to propose such a project. Currently, our English MA students cannot pursue these projects as an MRP; their only option is the public-facing independent project option embedded in English 799. They also do not usually have access to CultrSt 732, which offers an important introduction to key Cultural Studies terms and readings.

CSCT MA students, by turn, are required to complete MRPs but do not have the option to take English 799. However, 799's Public Humanities focus and space for research-creation work are strongly relevant to many of these students. Indeed, many CSCT MA students might well prefer 799's options for research-creation and/or public facing projects, as opposed to the more traditional writerly, academic-community focused MRP.

Learning outcomes will remain the same between the existing programs and the new merged program, as will almost all of the requirements (please see charts below).

As indicated in the charts above, we propose to keep CultrSt 732 under the revised course code ECS 732. Instead of this being a mandatory seminar for CSCT MA students it will be an elective course open to students in both the MRP and the course-based streams (as well as to students in our PhD programmes).

To ensure that students in both streams are adequately supported as they move toward independent work, each stream will also retain one mandatory Winter term course designed to act as a hub for cohort building and a supportive community for students to begin pursuing independent research. For the course-based stream, this hub will remain 799; for the MRP stream, the hub will be ECS 733, a revised iteration of what is currently CultrSt 733. Each core course will include a module designed to introduce students to key terms, frameworks, and practical skills designed to help anchor independent project/MRP work. The colloquium for each stream will also provide all MA students with professionalization skill-building opportunities in knowledge mobilization: each student will present their own research/research in progress for an interdisciplinary audience of peers and faculty members, and participate as an audience member for their fellow presenters.

The English and Cultural Studies MRP proposal, due in early February, will now be 500 words (down from the 1,000 word length of our current CSCT MRP proposal) plus bibliography, to better enable timely and constructive (peer) workshopping within ECS 733, focused around fundamental questions of scope, scale, and how to situate the research. The MRP length itself will be 30-40 pages plus bibliography (rather than 50 pages with bibliography). This reduction in final project length matches current practice in the CSCT MA programme introduced temporarily in response to the pandemic. Regularizing this practice has the added value of supporting MA MRP-stream students in producing journal-article length essays.

The proposed merger resulting in a two-stream degree titled MA in English and Cultural Studies will help us as a department to proactively address tensions noted in our last IQAP report related to the relationship between literary studies and cultural studies. In that report, external reviewers report confusion amongst students regarding how these two modes of inquiry speak to one another, as well as worries among faculty members that both approaches are not valued equally within our departmental culture. The current organization of our MA offerings, with two separate and separately named MA programs in which only elective courses are shared, inadvertently reinforces divisions eschewed by our departmental name change from over a decade ago. Reorganizing our MA programme offerings under a shared name will help to ameliorate this unintended problem by affirming the department's shared commitment to emphasizing productive synergies between literary and cultural studies and will better reinforce what is distinct about our department. (Indeed, we are also proposing to change the programme name for our PhD to English and Cultural Studies, so that all degree programmes within the department will now match the department name.)

Within the newly merged programme, each stream will have a core course that brings together student researchers working across literary and cultural studies frameworks. Each course will thus recognize and foster multiple approaches, and both streams will include student presentations at colloquia to which faculty members will be invited. These colloquia have the capacity to foster more richly interdisciplinary conversations amongst graduate students and faculty members alike.

#### **Proposed Programme Calendar Description**

The MA in English and Cultural Studies offers students valuable opportunities to exchange ideas in graduate coursework and to pursue independent research in literary studies, cultural studies, and/or critical theory.

Candidates for the M.A. in English and Cultural Studies will complete one of two possible streams.

Course-based stream: Students in the course-based stream complete six elective one-term graduate courses or their equivalent, with grades of at least B- in each, and one required core course (ECS 799), assessed on a pass/fail basis, that extends across the winter and spring/summer terms. ECS 799 acts as a hub for student-centred community and discussion regarding the Public Humanities, with a particular focus on writing with/in/for communities. Students in this course devise individual public-facing research or research-creation projects and present their projects at a colloquium in early August.

MRP stream: Students in the MRP (Major Research Project) stream complete five elective one-term graduate courses (or their equivalent) over the fall and winter terms, with grades of at least B- in each. They also take one required core course (ECS 733) assessed on a pass/fail basis, in the winter term. ECS 733 focuses on research methods in English and Cultural Studies and acts as a hub for supporting students as they begin planning independent work on their MRPs. Students are welcome to pursue Major Research Projects that engage literary studies, cultural studies, critical theory, and/or synergies between these fields. In late spring students present MRP work in progress at a colloquium and during the summer write a Major Research Project of 7,500 to 10,000 words (30 to 40 pages).

The M.A. degree normally requires one full year to complete.

The minimum admission requirement is a four-year undergraduate degree in a relevant discipline or disciplines, and with an average of B+ in at least six full or twelve half courses beyond the introductory level.

#### Describe the existing requirement/procedure:

A candidate for the M.A. in English will complete seven one-term graduate courses or their equivalent, three courses in each of the fall and winter terms and one required core course that extends across the winter and spring/summer terms, with grades of at least B- in each. The core course requires students to complete an independent project in the spring/summer, which will be assessed on a pass/fail basis by the course instructor.

#### Describe the existing requirement/procedure:

The department had previously approved a requirement that students attend a minimum of 12 seminars per year; however, there is no mechanism in place to track this, and no incentive/accountability associated with the current system.

### Provide a detailed description of the Recommended Change (Attach additional pages if space is not sufficient.)

We are proposing that all graduate students be required to register for a 2-term seminar course that is pass/fail. The requirements for this course are to attend at least 12 seminars and provide a short (3 sentence) description of each seminar, and/or answer a few short questions about the seminar. Eligible seminars include any university seminar, including our weekly departmental seminar, departmental seminars in any other department in the Faculty of Science or Health Sciences, and our specialty seminars (Ethology, Evolution, Behaviour (EEB), VOX). For students that have justified conflicts (e.g. TA duties, parenting), alternative activities will be developed in consultation with the course coordinator. Students will be required to register for this course each year, and they are required to pass the course for each year of in-time study in order to complete their degree. Departmental seminars will be recorded. In the event of failure, student will have the opportunity to view these recordings in order to pass this required course.

# Rationale for the Recommended Change (How does the requirement fit into the department's program and/or tie to existing Program Learning Outcomes from the program's IQAP cyclical review?):

The rationale for this change is to expose our graduate students to diverse approaches in science, encourage cross-disciplinary thinking, and strengthen our departmental research community. In our 2018 IQAP, it was recommended that all Biology graduate students be required to attend departmental seminars, and this course offering reflects our continuing efforts to promote seminar attendance by our graduate students.

600 level courses are counted as 3 units in the calendar and in Mosaic, but only as 1.5 units towards the program requirements. Also, the Advance Credit option (https://academiccalendars.romcmaster.ca/content.php?catoid=46&navoid=9200&hl=%22a dvanced+%22&returnto=search#2.3\_Advance\_Credit\_and\_Determination\_of\_Course\_Equiva lency) is not currently available to students.

All courses will be counted towards the program requirements with their actual unit count. The possibility of receiving advance credit for a 400 level Chemistry course for which a 600 level equivalent Chemistry course exists will be introduced and specifically highlighted.

# Rationale for the Recommended Change (How does the requirement fit into the department's program and/or tie to existing Program Learning Outcomes from the program's IQAP cyclical review?):

It causes confusion that the program administrator has to tell the students something different from Mosaic about whether they have fulfilled their course requirement, and it is not possible to change the unit count of 600 level courses in Mosaic. In either case, the required workload in a 600 level course justifies 3 units credit. For the Advance Credit, some of our undergrads are already loading up in 4th year on hard chemistry courses, working very hard in undergrad and ending up short of good course options when they start their MSc, effectively getting punished.

The 1.5 to 3 unit count change would be in effect immediately. No implementation plan is required since it simply requires the program to accept the existing reality of how courses are counted in Mosaic.

The minimum course requirement for the M.Sc. degree is five graduate modules (1.5 units each, 7.5 units total) or the equivalent, including CHEM 700 (1.5 units), with the remainder selected from any of the offered Chemistry modules, 600-level courses (one module credit



each), or extra-departmental graduate courses (usually two module credits each). The minimum passing grade for any course is B-. Students are strongly encouraged to complete a minimum of two prescribed modules within their sub-discipline (see Chemistry, Ph.D). A maximum of one 600-level course may be included in the minimum course requirement. In place of a 600-level course, students may instead receive advance credit for one Chemistry 400-level course taken (while completing 600-level material) in the department during their undergraduate degree at McMaster if a Chemistry 600-level equivalent of the course is listed in the Graduate Calendar (see Advance Credit). Advance credit must be approved by the supervisor of the student, the Associate Chair Graduate, Chemistry, as well as the Associate Dean Graduate, Science. Additional courses beyond the minimum requirement may be recommended by the supervisory committee.

## M.A. Degree

#### Admission

The Indigenous Studies M.A. program is an interdisciplinary program focusing on Indigenous people and communities. Students admitted to the M.A. program will complete 2 terms of coursework and have the option of either completing a Major Research Paper (MRP), or a Community-Based Research Project (CRP). In consultation with their supervisors, M.A. students must choose which option to pursue by October 15 of the first term of the program. Admission to the Indigenous Studies M.A. degree program requires an average of B+ or better in an undergraduate Honours Bachelor's degree or equivalent.

## **Degree Requirements**

Students will have two options for completing an M.A in Indigenous Studies.

# A. Course Work and Major Research Paper Option (MRP) (12 months)

Students will be required to complete the following: 3 core courses; 3 elective courses, one of which must be an Indigenous Studies course; one non-credit Professional development course; and a Major Research Paper:

- INDIGST 702 Indigenous Studies Research Methods, INDIGST 701 Theories in Critical Indigenous Studies, and INDIGST 704 Indigenous Studies Experiential Learning
- ii. In addition to these required courses, students will need to complete 3 elective courses. At least one of these courses must be an Indigenous Studies course.
- iii. Students will also complete one non-credit course, INDIGST 725 Professional Development
- iv. Students will complete a major research paper (MRP) of 7,500-8,500 words, excluding references. The research paper will be read by the supervisor and another faculty member. If the supervisor is an associate member, then the second reader must be a core faculty member selected by the supervisor in consultation with the student. Students will complete and submit their MRP for approval by their supervisor and the second reader by August of the first year.

## B. Course Work and Community-Based Research Project Option (CRP) (16 months)

Students will be required to complete the following: 3 core courses; 3 elective courses, one of which must be an Indigenous Studies course; one non-credit Professional development course; and a Community-Based Research Project:

 INDIGST 702 Indigenous Studies Research Methods, INDIGST 701 Theories in Critical Indigenous Studies, and INDIGST 704 Indigenous Studies Experiential Learning



- ii. In addition to these required courses, students will need to complete 3 electives. At least one of these courses must be an Indigenous Studies course.
- iii. Students will also complete one non-credit course, INDIGST 725 Professional Development
- iv. With the Community-Based Research Project (CRP), students will work with a community and/or community organization to conduct a research project that involves original and independent research (approximately 10,000-12,500 words excluding references). Students will work with their supervisor to have a research proposal complete and approved by December 1 of their first term. Students must select a committee member from the Indigenous Studies faculty complement or an approved associate member. Students will present their findings during the Indigenous Studies Graduate Student Symposium.

## **Core Courses**

## **INDIGST 701 Theories in Critical Indigenous Studies**

This course explores, interrogates, and synthesizes theories in critical Indigenous Studies. Indigenous Studies theories are informed locally and internationally by disciplines such as Literary and Performing Arts, Gender, History, Cultural Studies, Health, Education, Postcolonial Studies, Political Science, Sociology, and most importantly Indigenous traditions, laws, languages, and worldviews. Students will analyse the ways that theoretical developments in these cognate disciplines help inform research to improve the lives of Indigenous Peoples, the core reason why Indigenous Studies exists.

## **INDIGST 702 Indigenous Studies Research Methods**

This course emphasizes the development of skills and methods to conduct research and obtain data for and with Indigenous Peoples that ethically accesses and conveys Indigenous perspectives in ways that benefit Indigenous communities.

## **INDIGST 704 Indigenous Studies Experiential Learning Course**

This course will immerse students in a hands-on, land-based educational environment. Students will engage with Elders, knowledge keepers, and community members and gain an appreciation for experiential and service learning.

## **INDIGST 725 Professional Development**

Students will be required to complete this non-credit course. Students will meet once a month during the fall and winter terms and will learn various skills that will enhance their professional and career development. Skills that will be discussed in the course include grant-writing, creating paper/conference abstracts, learning how to present papers, CV development, and job search preparation, among others. As part of the course, all students will give a public presentation either to the department or at a conference. The course will be coordinated by the Graduate Chair with instruction shared by various faculty with expertise in their subject areas. Students will be assessed on a Pass/Fail basis.

## **Electives**

## INDIGST 6HH3 Indigenous Determinants of Health and Well-Being

First Nations, Inuit, and Métis peoples in Canada continue to experience a disproportionate burden of poor health and well-being compared to non-Indigenous peoples in Canada. These contemporary health disparities can be attributed to historical, colonial, and



contemporary policies of the state and decades of inequity experienced by Indigenous peoples as they work towards, economic, political, social, community, and individual health and well-being. In this interdisciplinary course, we will critically examine key determinants of Indigenous health and well-being as we engage with various concepts, theories, methods, and ethical issues.

# INDIGST 6C03 Queer, Two-Spirit, and Trans World-Making

This course focuses on queer, two-spirit, and trans Indigenous communities and rights in its study of "contemporary Indigenous societies and issues." This course will pay particular attention to the ways in which genderqueer, genderfluid, and nonbinary Indigenous individuals and political movements have always been at the center of anticolonial and decolonizing work.

## **INDIGST 705 Indigenous Studies Graduate Reading Course**

Students will work with their supervisor to develop a reading list that is relevant to their research project.

## Describe the existing requirement/procedure:

Students must demonstrate reading and research competence in an approved language other than English. Competence in a language is deemed to mean the ability to comprehend government documents, newspapers, and scholarly publications with the aid of a dictionary and, when it is appropriate to the student's intended



means of research, to be able to speak and comprehend to a level that will allow the student to conduct interviews. In all, cases the language requirement must be met prior to scheduling of the thesis proposal defense.

# Provide a detailed description of the Recommended Change (Attach additional pages if space is not sufficient.)

The department is proposing the following new policy for the language requirement for the PhD program:

#### Language Requirements

The PhD program has no formal second language requirement. The necessity for competence in a language other than English will depend on the student's field of study and the nature of their dissertation research. For example, students specializing in the field of Canadian Politics will likely require a reading ability in the French language. Similarly, students who conduct research in a site where English is not the primary language may need to demonstrate competence in the language of that country. The decision to require additional language training will be determined by the student's supervisory committee. The supervisory committee will make its recommendation about language training no later than 12 months after the student has been admitted into the PhD program. The decision is subject to approval by the Chair of the Graduate Committee.

Students who are required to demonstrate language competencies are strongly encouraged to complete the language requirement before seeking approval of their thesis proposal (i.e., normally by April of the student's second year in the doctoral program). However, there may be cases where this is not feasible (e.g., where language training takes place in conjunction with fieldwork). In such cases, the student must outline within the thesis proposal a clear plan and timetable of meeting the language requirement, with this plan to be approved by the relevant committee. Language training can consist of taking a university level language course, certified language tutoring, or other training.

# Rationale for the Recommended Change (How does the requirement fit into the department's program and/or tie to existing Program Learning Outcomes from the program's IQAP cyclical review?):

While most Political Science PhD programs in Canada require some kind of language requirement, there is significant variation. Some departments do not have a formal language requirement. Others (e.g. UBC) empower the student's supervisory committee to determine whether language training is necessary. Some programs allow students to demonstrate a research skill, such as a second language or advanced methods training. A few departments waive the language requirement for students whose native language is not English and who do not require supplementary language competency to conduct research.

The Department of Political Science has identified a number of concerns with our existing language requirement. First, it is unclear if the existing policy adequately prepares students to conduct research in a foreign language. For example, it is unlikely that earning a B+ in a first year French course will prepare students to conduct interviews in that language. As a result, students may satisfy their language requirement without ever acquiring a practical skill. Students are more likely to hire interpreters during their fieldwork and employ digital tools (e.g. Google translate, etc.) for translation.

Another concern is how we apply the language requirement to international students. The language requirement reads as if it was designed for students who are primarily Canadian or from a predominantly English-speaking background (e.g., US or UK students). Most international students come to our program



already able to use (speak, understand, write) at least one or two more languages in addition to English. Is it fair to make these students go through the whole testing requirement?

Finally, testing students for their language competency in languages other than major European ones (French, Spanish, etc.) is becoming increasingly difficult. McMaster does not offer a wide array of language courses. It also does not offer funding for graduate students to learn less commonly taught languages, as the University of Toronto does. So there is the added problem with making this a strict requirement in absence of an institutional commitment to actually teach those languages. Without such a pedagogical infrastructure, students and graduate chairs are left to figure out often on an ad hoc basis.
